Within the Civil Town of Munster, there are six such groups that meet occasionally: Plan Commission, Board of Parks & Recreation, Board of Safety, Board of Zoning Appeals, Economic Development Commission, and Nominating Committee. Additionally, the Munster Town Council also makes occasional appointments to the Hammond Sanitary District Board, Hammond Sanitary District Technical Review Committee, Munster Civic Foundation Executive Committee, and the South Shore Convention and Visitors Authority.

The selection process for these groups involves completing an application, being screened by the Nominating Committee, and receiving an appointment by the Town Council.
