### NIPSCO CONTINUES UPGRADES TO **ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE**

Today, NIPSCO announced plans to begin work on a natural gas upgrade project in the Towns of Munster and Highland. This project is just one of the existing and future investments planned as part of the company's long-term effort to modernize the gas and electric infrastructure across its entire service area.

Beginning in April, NIPSCO will start construction to replace 3.5 miles of underground natural gas transmission lines. Construction will begin from the Indiana/Illinois state line along Fisher Street to Indianapolis Boulevard and continue through the Ridge Road intersection to Highland. Construction is expected to run from April through November 2016.

Notifications have been sent to residents in the immediate area and NIPSCO has been working closely to coordinate logistics with Town officials, the school system and hospital. As work approaches, NIPSCO will also work with local media and the Towns of Highland and Munster to keep residents notified of project schedules, road and bike trail closures and other updates.

Environmental surveys for the project were completed to fully assess environmentally sensitive features within the proximity of the project. As with every project, NIPSCO's project team worked with the regulating agencies and local stakeholders to avoid, minimize and mitigate environmental impacts for this project.

NIPSCO reminds customers who travel near construction areas to please exercise caution to ensure personal safety and the safety of construction crews working on this project.

The new natural gas lines are being installed to provide safer and more reliable service to area residents and businesses in the future.

# Abril Showers

April showers bring more than May flowers. Spring rains can cause flooding of yards and streets. Most of the time flooding can be prevented

**DRAIN GRATES** 

by making sure the drain grates are kept free of debris. It doesn't take much to clog a drain and have it cause significant flooding of streets and/or yards. As material such as leafs, twigs, and litter are washed from the ground surface it collects onto the drain grating and acts like a rubber plug. The flow of water runoff into the drainage system is drastically reduced when material collects near or on the drain grate. Residents can do their part by helping keep drains near your home free of debris.

### **BRANCH COLLECTION**

Starting April 4<sup>th</sup>, weather permitting; branches will be picked up with the chipper on the same day as your garbage and recycling pick up. These branches should be no longer than 5' long and 3" in diameter. In the spring and fall there are a lot of branches out and there may be times when we are a day or two later picking up the branches due to the heavy volume or rainy weather.

Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small branches should be bundled and tied; these will be picked up with your garbage. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.

### **SPRING LEAF COLLECTION**

Starting Monday, April 4<sup>th</sup> through Friday, April  $22^{nd}$ , between the hours of 7 am and 2 pm. Munster will be having the spring leaf collection, weather permitting. Do not put




leaves in your garbage can, plastic bags or in brown bags, Waste Management will not pick them up. Rake your leaves to the curb for the spring leaf collection.

Since pick-up quantities are not known, it is difficult to predict exactly which neighborhood will be picked up on which day, so please have your leaves out on Monday. We will start on the northwest section of Town on Monday, April 6th and work south. If the Town is completed before the week is over, we will go through the Town again.

Please place your leaves in a continuous long pile. We will be using a leaf vacuum to collect your leaves. If your street has curbs, please place your leaves right behind the curb on the grass parkway. PLEASE DO NOT PLACE LEAVES IN THE STREET. If your street does not have curbs, please place your leaves on the edge of the street pavement. Also, please be careful not to mix leaves with large sticks, rocks or other debris, which could cause injury to an employee or damage to the equipment. Thank you for your cooperation.
