JULY 3, 2016 FIREWORKS

The Town of Munster will once again be hosting its annual fireworks show, on July 3, 2016, at Centennial Park. This may present some difficulties for some attendees due to the construction of Centennial Village at the north end of Centennial Park. The construction may impede access to the park from the north and will significantly reduce the amount of greenspace available for viewing the fireworks display. The planners for this event are working to address these issues and identify alternate viewing sites.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING PICK UP

Waste Management picks up the garbage and recycling in the Town and their hours of pick up are from 6 am to 5 pm, please have your garbage and recycling out no later than 6 am on your regular pick up day. According to Munster Code:

"The resident shall be responsible for placing the containers at the curb not earlier than 12:00 noon on the day proceeding the designated collection day, and for promptly retrieving the container after emptying by the end of the day of collection".

MUNSTER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Munster Fire Department is looking for new membership. If you are interested in applying please contact the Fire Chief's Office at 219-836-6960. Office hours are Monday through Thursday 9 am - 2 pm and Friday 9 am - 1 pm.

The Munster Fire Department is primarily a paid on call department. We are an organization with goals, policies, and performance standards. This philosophy provides the ability to protect the citizens, visitors and property of the Town of Munster.

A firefighter is a trained individual who promptly responds to mitigate a wide range and variety of emergency and non-emergency situations where life, property or the environment is at risk. A firefighter's assignments vary based on training, experience and ability.

A firefighter's duties include fire suppression (including structural, transportation and all other types of fires); fire prevention and public education' and may include emergency medical services assistance, hazardous materials response and preparedness, technical rescues (extrication, water, high angle or confined space); urban search and rescue, disaster preparedness and mitigation; community service activities; and any activity related to public safety.

Eligibility requirements for the Munster Fire Department includes:

- 18 years of age and a high school graduate or GED equivalent.
- Residency within 1 mile of the Town of Munster or work solely within the Town of Munster.
- Must possess a valid driver's license without record of suspension or revocation in any state and provide proof of insurance.
- No felony convictions or disqualifying criminal history within the past seven years.
- You will need to attend a fire academy class at no cost to you which will prepare you for your job tasks.



BRANCHES

The Public Works Department has the chipper out every week day picking up branches. The chipper starts in the northwest section of town and continues throughout the week picking up branches. The chipper will continue the route each day starting where they left off the previous day. Due to storms it may take longer than a week for the chipper to make it thru the town. Please be patient, we will get to your branches. DO NOT CALL IN FOR BRANCH PICK UP. The chipper goes up and down every street in town picking up branches, they will get to you.

If you have pulled out bushes with a root ball, please call the Public Works Office at 836-6971 for a pick up. Root balls must be removed from the bush and put in a separate pile. The chipper cannot pick up root balls.

Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Leaves are not considered yard waste. You cannot put leaves in the garbage, Waste Management will not pick them up. Small piles of branches should either be put in the garbage can or bundled/ tied and set next to the garbage can, these will be picked up by Waste Management. HOW TO DISPOSE OF

Computers and Electronics – The Munster Public Works Department has a recycling shed for electronics at the Public Works Garage, 508 Fisher Street, in the recycling area to the right of their driveway. The shed is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is no attendant on sight to help unload the computers and electronics.

Latex Paint – latex paint can be put into your regular garbage IF IT IS COMPLETELY DRY. You will need to take the top off and put either kitty litter or sand into the paint and let it sit out for a couple of days to dry up. Once it is dried out, you can place it in the garbage. If it is not dry, once the hopper compresses on the garbage truck, you will have paint down your street. PLEASE MAKE SURE IT IS COMPLETELY DRY.

You can also take latex paint for recycling to the City of Hobart Yard, 340 S. Shelby Street, Hobart. Drop off days will be Monday – Friday 7 am to 2:45 pm, Saturdays 8 am to 11:45 am. **No oil based paint will be accepted.** Any questions please call Hobart City Yard at 219-942-6121.

Large Items (Sofas, Household Furniture, Carpeting, Bicycles, Mattresses, Etc.) – Waste Management will pick up ONE large item a week with your normal garbage, you do not need to call in for the pick up.

Oil Based Paint and Solvents – you will need to take these items to a household hazardous waste pick up. Munster's Household Hazardous Waste pick up will be Saturday, May 7th, 9am to 2pm at the Public Works Garage, 508 Fisher Street.

Carpet – Waste Management will pick up carpet that is cut into 5 foot lengths, rolled and bound. It can be bound with electrical tape or string and put out on your normal pick up day. If the carpet is not bound, it will not be picked up.

As you have likely noticed, NIPSCO has begun work on their natural gas upgrade project in the Towns of Munster and Highland.

Construction began at the state line along Fisher Street as well as the Boulevard in Highland. Fisher will remain lane-restricted until about the week of May 16th. Construc-



tion is expected to run from April through November 2016.

This project will require closing Calumet Avenue for one weekend. Right now, that weekend is scheduled to be the one beginning on June 10. It will re-open on Monday the 13. This date may change based on NIPSCO's progress. If this date changes, the Town will make updates to this schedule available via NIXLE alert, print, and social media.

Please exercise caution to ensure personal safety and the safety of construction crews working on this project.
