held on Tuesday, August 2 from 5 pm to 9 pm at the Munster Community Pool. This event is held annually to promote police and community partnerships through a variety of both fun and educational activities for all ages.

This year's celebration will include free swimming for Munster residents (with state ID), door prizes, kids games and bounce houses, police cars, fire trucks, K-9 demonstrations, a police helicopter landing, handouts and giveaways from local businesses, a SWAT vehicle and exhibit, free child identification cards, self-defense demonstrations, The Magic of Steve Kellogg, costumed characters, a souvenir photo booth, face painting, balloon animals, glow necklaces for kids, crime prevention information, barrel car train rides for kids, music and food. #### **HOW TO DISPOSE OF ......**

Computers and Electronics – The Munster Public Works Department has a recycling shed for electronics at the Public Works Garage, 508 Fisher Street, in the recycling area to the right of the driveway. The shed is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is not an attendant on sight to help unload the computers and electronics.

Latex Paint – Latex paint can be put into your regular garbage IF IT IS COMPLETELY DRY and the lid is removed. To dry out latex paint, kitty litter or sand can be added to the paint. Once the paint mixture solidifies it can be placed in the garbage with the lid removed. If it is not dry when the garbage truck hopper compresses the paint can, paint is expelled into the streets. Please make sure paint is completely dry before disposal.

Latex Paint Recycling – The City of Hobart Yard, 340 S. Shelby Street, Hobart accepts latex paint for recycling. Drop off days are Monday – Friday 7 am to 2:45 pm, Saturdays 8 am to 11:45 am. No oil based paint will be accepted. Any questions please call Hobart City Yard at 219-942-6121.

Oil Based Paint and Solvents — Oil based paint and solvents are hazardous waste items. Hazardous waste is collected by Lake County Solid Waste District. Additional household hazardous waste disposal information and list of scheduled disposal sites can be obtained at

Large Items (Sofas, Household Furniture, Carpeting, Bicycles, Mattresses, Etc.) – Waste Management will pick up ONE large item per week with your normal garbage collection. It is <u>not</u> necessary to call or schedule a pickup.

Carpet – Waste Management picks up carpeting that is cut into 4ft by 6ft sections, rolled and bound. It can be bound with electrical tape or string and put out on your normal collection day. If the carpet is not bound, it will not be picked up.

#### LAWN MAINTENANCE CODE

62-113 code states residents are required to maintain all lawn areas including easements and alley areas. Length of grass areas shall not exceed six inches and weeds shall be cut.

## TREE TRIMMING OF PARKWAY TREES - CUTTING BACK TREES AND BUSHES IN ALLEYS

According to Munster Code, upkeep of the parkway trees is the responsibility of the property owner. Trees should be trimmed to a proper height so as not to interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic. There are numerous trees that are growing into the streets hitting vehicles. The Public Works Department will be cutting back these trees throughout the spring and summer months to avoid damage to vehicles. The tree limbs hanging into the street will be cut back to the curb line.

Some alleys within the Town are overgrown with bushes and trees. When town trucks and/or garbage trucks are unable to drive through these alleys without damaging the vehicles, the Public Works Department will cut back these obstructions and overgrowth areas.

If you do not want your trees or bushes cut back by the town, please keep your trees and bushes maintained far enough back so that they are not growing into the street or alley. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.


#### WELCOME STEPHEN GUNTY
