Re: 2022 and 2023 park fertilization

A request for proposals was sought for 2021 fertilization services for the parks and recreation department. That schedule was awarded in 2021 to Forever Green from Crown Point at a total cost of \$20,267.55. The proposal included that the agreement could be extended for an additional three years at the same price if agreed to by both parties.

Attached to the agenda packets is a signed willingness from Tony Powell, Senior Account Manager for Forever Green to hold their prices for the 2022 and 2023 seasons at the 2021 awarded amount.

Staff is very satisfied with our previous experience with Forever Green.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends extending the current agreement with Forever Green for the 2022 and 2023 seasons at an annual cost not to exceed \$20,267.55.
