# Town of Munster – Department of Parks & Recreation Board Report June 17, 2025

## **Administration & Capital Projects**

#### Landfill Gas Header Replacement:

- Scheduled gas collection line replacements are completed.
- Additional work remains in the pipeline.

#### • Centennial Park Clubhouse Redevelopment:

- o Park Board held a work-study session on June 3, building on prior meetings.
- Collaboration with HWC Engineering and SEH continues, focusing on demolition and electrical reconfiguration.
- o Electrical feed rerouted from Clubhouse to the new Pro Shop via Midwestern Electric.

#### West Lakes Park Washroom:

o CSK Architects are finalizing detailed design and specs for upcoming bid phase.

### • Briar Creek Park Playground:

- Playground installation is complete and open.
- Contractor supplying longer chains for belt swings to enhance accessibility.

#### • Fisher Street Trail Assessment:

- AES conducted geotechnical surveys; asphalt depth ranged between 1.25"-3".
- o Data will guide 2026 trail repave planning by SEH.

#### • Bridge Installations Over Ditches:

- o Gariup Inc. awarded contract; bridges have a 42–44 week lead time.
- o Construction will commence in July, with most work likely spilling into 2026.

## **Recreation & Community Events**

### Staff Training & Outreach:

- Superintendent participated in an IPRA webinar on LGBTQAI2S+ inclusivity.
- Met with NWI Town Planner for 2026 advertising campaigns, anticipating budget constraints.
- Secured School Town of Munster partnership for bi-weekly camper busing to the pool.
- Superintendent attended the Chamber of Commerce luncheon.

#### • Summer Intern & Program Staffing:

Recreation Intern onboarded; supporting sports camps, pool management, and Touch A
 Truck event logistics.

#### Pool Operations:

- Pool opened May 29 6½ days closed out of 8 possible in May due to cold temperatures;
   137 attendees on open days, plus 144 at one private party.
- Season passholders have reached 844.
- New credit card readers installed.

#### Summer Camp Updates:

- Week 1 included activities like Zao Island, pool visits, face painting, and Chipotle lunch.
- o June camp is over-enrolled; additional subs and second-round staff training are in place.

## Program Enrollment (ongoing):

- o Tennis: 50 youth, 19 adults, plus 5 private/semi-private lessons.
- Swim lessons: 19 kids (weekday), 46 (Saturday), with 3 Intro-to-Diving participants.
- Other programs: Sports Camps (22), BLAST (12), Hispanic Heritage Dance (9), Destination Español (6).

#### Recent Events:

- Bark in the Park: ~700 attendees; earlier timing, cooler weather welcomed; featured vendors and contests.
- Tunes on Tuesday added a 'Pop-Up Concert' with Highland Community Concert Band at Centennial Park on June 3<sup>rd</sup> ~100 attendees.
- Sunday Summer Concert Series: Began with '28 Days', was moved indoors due to weather—attendance was ~75.
- Upcoming Events in Planning:
  - Decades Fest: 50s-70s theme (Fri); 80s-present theme (Sat) with vintage cars, "Friends"-themed trivia, dancing.
  - *Kid's Fest*: Vendor secured; finalizing entertainment lineup.

## Facility Rentals:

- Tours: 42 conducted year-to-date.
- o Rentals: 82 total in 2025 (Jan-May), including weddings, shelter use, and pool events.

  - Soccer goal storage and turf repairs at Grove and West Lakes.

- Centennial irrigation fixes.
- Landfill well weed trimming.
- o Event setups: DARE graduation, Bark in the Park, Tunes on Tuesday Concert.
- o Pressure washing of stage/shelter floors.
- o Staff trained on new irrigation control systems.
- o Ball cleaner relocated and replumbed.
- o Town-wide event banners displayed.
- o Re-installed maintenance gate at Community Park ball field.
