Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Dr. Lorin Brown at 7:02 a.m. Other members present: Jerry Baffa, Linda Dunn, and Town Council Member Charles Gardiner.

Others present: Chief of Police Stephen Scheckel, Lieutenants Dan Broelmann and Daymon Johnston, Fire Chief David Pelc, Town Attorney David Westland, Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police Nancy Nadratowski, Clerk Treasurer Personnel Patricia Abbott, Town Manager Dustin Anderson, Superior Ambulance Personnel Jeff Collins, Joe Salas, David Farber and Tristan DeFord.

Ms. Dunn motioned to accept the Consent Agenda items. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye, motion approved 3-0.

III. Items for Action & Discussion

Dr. Brown asked Ms. Dunn or Mr. Baffa to comment on the Superior report and meeting. Ms. Dunn stated that everything is in order. They had a few questions which Superior personnel answered satisfactory. Superior personnel informed them that we are under the national average for response times, both to the scene and to the patient. Ms. Dunn stated the last few months have been busy, to include many mutual aid calls, though everything is status quo. Mr. Baffa added that Superior is doing good. Dr. Brown asked if there were any issues in sealing off the north from the south? Mr. Collins stated there were no problems.

IV. Chief's Comments

Chief Scheckel informed the Board that Lt. Johnston has completed the annual process to renew and inspect the four (4) tow companies providing service for the town. Lt. Johnston reported that there were no issues or problems reported from last year. We currently have four (4) companies on the list though the policy does allow for five (5). Last year the four (4)

companies each averaged 210 calls for service. Dr. Brown asked if it was 210 calls divided by each of the companies? Lt. Johnston said no, 210 calls per company. Mr. Baffa asked if we had eight hundred (800) tows in a year? Lt. Johnston answered yes, between accidents and arrests. We haven't had issues and have been happy with the service provided. The one (1) spot available was from a company who we had issues in the past with their lack of professionalism. Mr. Baffa asked if the current companies can handle the call volume? Lt. Johnston said yes. Mr. Baffa asked if there were any issues having a shortage of providers? Lt. Johnston said no, there haven't been any. Ms. Dunn asked then there is no need to add a fifth company? Lt. Johnston stated it is the Board's choice to add another company. Dr. Brown asked if anyone else is begging to get on the list? Lt. Johnston answered if they could be on the list it is money in their pocket. He added that the providers will be reevaluated in 2022. Mr. Baffa asked if the volume of calls go up will any of the other companies want to join mid-year? Lt. Johnston answered yes.

Ms. Dunn motioned to accept the Tow Service Providers with a full review in 2022. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye, motion approved 3-0.

Chief Scheckel informed the Board of a shooting, that occurred before Christmas, at the Hookah store on Calumet Avenue, which left the store shot up. The Investigations Unit spend hundreds of hours investigating this incident, which was not a random act. They have charged four (4) individuals with attempted murder, attempted battery by means of a deadly weapon and criminal recklessness. There were eighteen (18) shell casings recovered and thankfully no one was hit. The incident stems from a family arguing with another family about a woman. The individuals are not in custody at this time.

Chief Scheckel informed the Board that the bank robbery suspect, from First Midwest, was in custody within twelve (12) hours of the incident. He is currently at the University of Chicago hospital as he jumped out of a fourth story window prior to being arrested. He sustained a shattered pelvis, broken legs and internal damage. Mr. Baffa asked if a weapon was displayed? Chief Scheckel stated no. Dr. Brown asked if there was another bank robbery, prior to ours? Chief Scheckel said he believed there was one in either Highland or Hammond, and the suspect was picked up.

Chief Pelc informed the Board that the department lost a retired member. Mike Horvath, a forty (40) year veteran of the department, passed away on Christmas Eve.

Chief Pelc stated that last year ended good and the new year is starting out busy. They assisted on the Park West apartment fire in Griffith and provided mutual aide to a few departments in Illinois.

Chief Pelc informed the Board of the promotion of Joseph Lash to Lieutenant. Mr. Lash is a strong member of the Lansing Fire Department, where he serves as a Lieutenant and EMS coordinator. His promotion will add to the department's service for the town. Ms. Dunn asked if he will continue with Lansing? Chief Pelc said yes, that is his full-time job.

Chief Pelc informed the Board they will be licensed as a BLS department. Meaning they can provide assistance on scene, per hospital guidelines, until such time an ambulance can arrive. This will result in giving them a better opportunity to serve the residents. The department was last licensed in 2005. Mr. Gardiner asked what BLS stands for? Chief Pelc answered Basic Life Support. Dr. Brown asked how that will mesh with Superior? Chief Pelc said they will be able to provide aid though not transport. Dr. Brown asked how does it match with the Police Department? Chief Pelc said it is more advanced with formal regulations from the state. It gives guidelines for no legal ramifications. Dr. Brown asked if the Police Department is on scene before the Fire Department? Chief Scheckel replied yes, if there is a full arrest the officers are rendering CPR and attaching the AED until the ambulance arrives on scene. Care is then transferred to the paramedics while the officers stay on scene to assist if things go bad. Chief Pelc stated it is just added coverage for the town.

V. Old Business

Mr. Baffa expressed the Board's condolences to the Fire Department for the loss of their fireman.

There was no new business.

VII. Board's Comments

There were comments from the Board.

VIII. Open to the Public

Mr. Andy Talka, from Tom & Ed's Autobody & Towing addressed the Board asking to be considered as the fifth spot in the tow rotation. They were on the rotation in the past and asked to be added as an additional option or to replace a low performer on the list. Dr. Brown asked if the Police Department had any comments? Lt. Johnston stated that they did pass inspection. Chief Scheckel added it is up to the Board, there is nothing to take them out of consideration. Ms. Dunn asked if we added a fifth company will it reduce the rotation? Chief Scheckel replied yes. Mr. Baffa asked if they can handle all types of vehicles? Lt. Johnston answered yes. Chief Scheckel asked Mr. Talka how many tow vehicles they have? Mr. Talka replied two (2), though they do not have the capabilities to do semis. Chief Scheckel explained that the computer generates a list which the dispatchers work off. They try the first company and if they can't handle the call they move to the next one on the list. Dr. Brown said they would leave it up to the Police Department. Chief Scheckel stated they have no objection though want to keep the process streamlined. Mr. Baffa asked if the companies have to pay any fees? Lt. Johnston said they must be registered with the town and complete backgrounds on their drivers. Mr. Gardiner asked if the Police Department was aware of Tom & Ed's? Lt. Johnston answered yes. Mr. Gardiner suggested that the Board take the Police Department's recommendation as Lt. Johnston has gone through the process as required.

Ms. Dunn motioned to take another look at the Tow Company providers at the next meeting and refer the matter back to the staff. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye, motion approved 3-0.

Mr. Westland agreed with Mr. Gardiner's comments. The Board shouldn't take the work Lt. Johnston completed and disregard it, though give it the same consideration. There is currently four (4) in place; make a recommendation in February. He thanked Tom & Ed's for coming out, though we don't need to make a decision right now. The report will be placed back on the agenda for the next meeting with four (4) companies being standard, with an optional fifth.

Mr. Baffa asked if there were only two (2) companies that could handle semis? Lt. Johnston said no, there are four (4): Stan's, Double T, Ray & Wally's and Bert's.

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, February 20, 2020.

IX. Adjournment

Mr. Baffa motioned to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Dunn seconded the motion. All members present voted aye, motion approved 3-0. Meeting was adjourned at 7:35 a.m.

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
