Munster Board of Safety Meeting Minutes
Tuesday, August 20, 2024

Munster Town Hall Main Meeting Room

This meeting was held in person at the Munster Town Hall and via Microsoft Teams.

I. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Dr. Lorin Brown at 7:02 a.m. Other members present: Jerry Baffa, Dr. Robert Dershewitz, and Linda Dunn.

Others present: Chief of Police Stephen Scheckel, Lieutenants Dan Broelmann and Daymon Johnston, Administrative Assistant to the Chief of Police Nancy Nadratowski, Accreditation/Public Records Manager Craig Corie, Fire Chief Mark Hajduk, Deputy Fire Chief Dave Strbjak (online), Captain Mike Harrigan, Fireman/EMT Dan Zobica, Town Attorney David Westland, Clerk Treasurer Wendy Mis, Controller/Interim Town Manager Patricia Abbott, Superior Ambulance Personnel Jeff Collins, Jan Cox, Joe Salas, Armani Porter, and Interim Director of Operations-Public Works Chris Spolnik.

Pledge of Allegiance

Public Comment: There was no public comment.

II. Consent Agenda

Mr. Baffa motioned to accept the Consent Agenda items. Dr. Dershewitz seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

III. Items for Action & Discussion

- A. Superior Ambulance Report for July 2024

Ms. Dunn stated they are keeping the chase vehicle at the south Fire Station for a trial period. The response times are slightly longer on a few calls though it is too soon to tell if there is a negative impact. Average time to patient's side is still good at 4:04. They will continue for another month and assess it at that time.

Mr. Baffa motioned to accept the Superior Report for July. Ms. Dunn seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

IV. Fire Chief's Report

Chief Hajduk stated it was a decent month. National Night Out went well. Thursday, August 22nd they will be hosting the district meeting. September 28th they will be doing a smoke detector blitz in Independence Park associated with the Red Cross, who will be supplying the smoke detectors. This is similar to what they did two (2) years ago with the Rotary grant.

V. Police Chief's Report

Chief Scheckel stated that last night the Town Council approved adding six (6) additional officers to the department. The Council is looking for the Board of Safety's recommendation. Mr. Westland added the Council took the action last night and is looking for the Board of Safety's approval.

Dr. Dershewitz motioned to add six (6) additional officers to the Police Department. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

A. Emergency Hiring Eligibility Register

Chief Scheckel asked the Board to approve the Hiring Eligibility Register from the last round of interviews for Emergency Hire.

Mr. Baffa made a motion to certify the Emergency Hiring Eligibility Register. Ms. Dunn seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

B. Administrative Special Order #24-06

Chief Scheckel informed the Board of Officer Alec Spicer's move to 1st Class, at the end of his probation.

VI. Old Business

There was no old business.

VII. New Business

Interim Director of Operations-Public Works Chris Spolnik addressed the Board asking for changes in speed limit and stop sign placement for various locations within town. Chief Scheckel stated all the items brought up are problematic and there are no objections to the changes. Mr. Westland stated that in order to enforce the law the Board would need to recommend the changes so an ordinance could be drafted to go before the Town Council. The Board motioned and voted as follows:

A. Beverly & Forest: change the two (2) way stop to a four (4) way stop.

Mr. Baffa made a motion to accept the proposal for a four-way stop at Beverly & Forest. Ms. Dunn seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

B. 30th & Monroe, 30th & Jefferson: change the two (2) way stops to four (4) way stops.

Dr. Dershewitz made a motion to accept the recommendation to change the two (2) way stops to four (4) ways at the intersections of 30th & Monroe and 30th & Jefferson. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

C. Camellia & Oriole: add two (2) new stop signs at this intersection, east & west bound.

Mr. Baffa made a motion to install stop signs at the intersection of Camellia & Oriole. Ms. Dunn seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

D. Fran Lin: reduce the speed limit from 35 mph to 25 mph.

Ms. Dunn made a motion to reduce the speed on Fran Lin from 35 mph to 25 mph. Mr. Baffa seconded the motion. All members present voted aye by roll call vote, motion approved 4-0.

Interim Director Spolnik stated they will put out message boards on Fran Lin posting the new speed limit. Also, notice will be put in the town water bills/News You Can Use. Solar powered radar signs will be installed on Fran Lin as well.

Rumble strips will be installed on Hohman by Sunnyside Park as a way to give drivers notice of the park and people crossing in the area. Flashing crosswalks have also been installed in the area. Community Hospital will be installing a push button crosswalk light at MacArthur & Columbia for their employees to cross.

VIII. Board's Comments

Mr. Baffa congratulated the Police Department on another great National Night Out.

The next meeting will be Tuesday, September 17th.

IX. Adjournment

Mr. Baffa motioned to adjourn the meeting. Dr. Dershewitz seconded the motion. All members present voted aye, motion approved 4-0. Meeting was adjourned at 7:40 a.m.

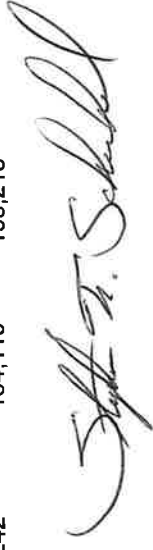

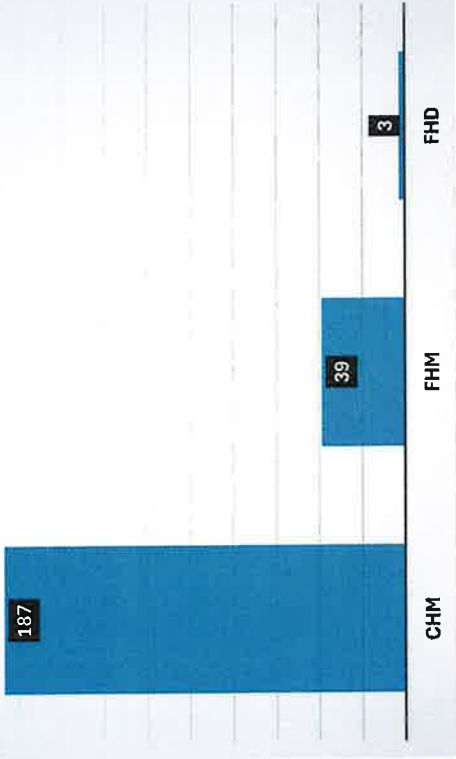

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to establish a set standard for uniform dress and use by all members of the department.

Policy

Determining what Uniform to Wear

At a minimum all events that members take part in as a representative of the Munster Fire Department; a Class B uniform will be worn. Examples of such events are as follows but not limited to, special duty assignments, public events, Festivals, etc.

Drills, outside training, special training, etc. a class C uniform is required.

It is the responsibility of the senior officer in charge of the event to determine what uniform is needed. The officer shall contact all members that are attending prior to the date of the event and advise them of what uniform will be needed. It is the responsibility of the member to acquire all the items needed for that uniform.

Uniforms

1. Class A or Dress Uniform – Firefighter:

- a. Non issued Flying Cross 35W5435 light blue long-sleeve dress shirt (Neatly pressed)
- b. Non issued men's Fechheimer 32230 woman's 32230W, LAPD navy-blue dress pants
- c. Non issued navy-blue Class A, Flying Cross 38800 single breasted dress coat
- d. Navy-blue tie
- e. Non issued navy-blue air force style dress hat
- f. Black belt
- g. Black polishable shoes or patent leather
- h. MFD provided name tag bar (worn above right breast pocket)
- i. MFD provided badge (worn above the left breast pocket)
- j. White T-shirt under dress shirt

2. Class A or Dress Uniform – Chief Officer / Officer:

- a. Non issued Flying Cross 35W54 white long-sleeve dress shirt (Neatly pressed)
- b. Non issued men's Fechheimer 32230 woman's 32230W, LAPD navy-blue dress pants

- j. MFD provided badge (worn above the left breast pocket)
- k. White T-shirt under dress shirt

3. Class B Uniform – Firefighter/Lieutenants/Captains:

- a. Midnight Navy blue short-sleeve work shirt. 5.11 Tactical 71167. (Neatly pressed).
- b. Midnight Navy Blue 5.11 Tactical 74371 or 74427 pants. (optional) Midnight Navy Blue 5.11 Tactical 73327 or 73308 Shorts.
- c. Black belt
- d. Dark Blue or Black socks
- e. Black polishable shoes or Black work boots
- f. MFD provided name Bar tag (worn above right breast pocket).
- g. MFD provided badge (worn above the left breast pocket).
- h. MFD jacket (if needed because of weather)
- i. Blue department issued t-shirt to be worn under work shirt.

Dark Navy-blue ties are optional on the Class B uniform. It will be at the discretion of the senior officer of the event to determine if ties are needed.

4. Class B Uniform – Chief Officers

- a. White or Midnight Navy short-sleeve work shirt 5.11. White Shirt is Tactical 71177. Midnight Nave Shirt is Tactical 71167 (Neatly pressed)
- j. Midnight Navy Blue 5.11 Tactical 74371 or 74427 pants. (optional) Midnight Navy Blue 5.11 Tactical 73327 or 73308 Shorts.
- b. Black belt
- c. Dark Blue or Black socks
- d. Black polishable shoes or Black work boots
- e. MFD provided collar brass, determined by your rank.
- f. MFD provided name tag bar (worn above right breast pocket)
- g. MFD provided badge (worn above the left breast pocket)
- h. MFD jacket (if needed because of weather)
- i. White T-shirt under white tactical shirt or Blue Department issued t-shirt to be worn under midnight navy blue tactical shirt.

- j. Dark Navy- blue ties are optional on the Class B uniform. It will be at the discretion of the senior officer of the event to determine if ties are needed.

5. Class C Uniform – All members:

- a. Navy blue MFD Department T-shirt or department Sweatshirt, navy blue polo shirt, or job shirt.
- b. Black or dark Navy-blue pants. (optional) Bermuda style, Dark Navy Blue or black shorts
- c. White or navy-blue Polo Chief Officers, Light Gray or navy-blue Polo Lieutenants and Captains
- d. Black belt
- e. Black shoes or Black work boots
- f. Dark blue or Black
- g. Optional MFD Baseball cap
- h. Optional MFD jacket

Provided Items

The following items are to be provided by the MFD to the member within 30 days of hire:

- a. One short-sleeve, **class B** shirt, color depending on rank.
- b. One set of class B/work pants
- c. Two MFD T-shirts
- d. Two MFD polo shirts
- e. One MFD Sweatshirt and one Job shirt
- f. One MFD baseball cap and one stocking hat
- g. One MFD Jacket
- h. Badge
- i. Name tag bar (silver or gold depending on rank)
- j. Black Belt

Note: Additional uniform items may be purchased by the individual upon approval from the Staff.

The following will be provided for Chief Officers and Officers:

- a. Chief – Gold – 5 crossed bugles badge and collar pins **and name bar**. White shirt
- b. Deputy Chief – Gold – 4 crossed bugles badge and collar pins **and name bar**. White shirt
- c. Battalion Chief – Gold – 3 crossed bugles badge and collar pins **and name bar**. White shirt
- d. Captains – Silver – 2 parallel bugles badge and collar pins **and name bar**. White shirt

- e. Lieutenants – Silver – 1 bugle badge and collar pins **and name bar**. Midnight Navy Blue Shirt.

The following will be provided for state certified Engineers:

Engineers – Silver – collar pins

Uniform Accessories

Name tag: The name tag shall be centered on the right shirt pocket. The bottom of the nametag shall be even with the top of the shirt pocket. **and shall be the same style as the issued name bar**

Rank Insignia: Rank insignia is gold or silver in color and is issued to the department officers only. When wearing the rank insignia on the shirt collar, the widest part of the bugle(s) shall be centered to the point of the collar 1/4" from the edge. **All pins shall be the same as the pins issued by the Fire Department**

Class A and Class B uniform shirts and class A coats shall have A PROPER American flag, sewn on the right sleeve. For Chief Officers, the flag should have a gold boarder. Captains and Lieutenants should have a silver border for ALL others, the flag will have a white border.

Class A and Class B uniform shirts and class A coats shall have the Munster Fire Department patch sewn to the left sleeve.

If you are a certified EMT B or EMT P, The American flag shall be removed and a patch with the appropriate classification can be sewn to the right sleeve. This is on shirts ONLY. NO EMS patch is allowed on a Class A dress coat.

Additional Guidelines

- a. Uniforms will always be neatly pressed and clean.
- b. If uniforms of any class have rips, tears fading or stains, that piece must be replaced.
- c. Additional objects such as, wallets, keys, knives, jewelry shall not interfere with the uniform, and cannot be attached, or be exposed.
- d. In addition to the above mentioned, when in a quiet setting or when directed by the senior officer, all electronic devices shall be placed in the vibrate position and not used, unless it is an emergency or turned off. (i.e., training, funerals, special ceremonies, etc.)
- e. The cuffs will be buttoned when wearing the long sleeve department shirt.
- f. Nothing else can be worn over, attached, or altered from the above listed uniforms unless you have obtained **written** approval from the Fire Chief.
- g. Once the fire chief has approved an alteration, addition, etc. All personnel will be notified, and the alteration, addition, etc. will be uniform for all personnel.

Apparatus/Station Logo

1. Each apparatus/station will have the ability to design one logo per apparatus/station utilizing the following parameters:
 - a. The apparatus/station logo will be no larger than the current MFD Department patch.
 - b. The apparatus/station logo will not incorporate any features that may be interpreted as offensive or degrading to emergency services.
 - c. The apparatus/station logo will identify both the MFD and the respective apparatus/station within the design.
 - d. All designs must be approved by the Command Staff prior to any application; and, The Fire Chief has the final approval authority of the apparatus/station logo.
2. Each apparatus/station will approve the acceptable design via a simple majority of members assigned to the respective apparatus/station at the time of submission.
 - a. The logo design will not be submitted to the Command Staff if no majority is reached by the respective apparatus/station.
 - b. The logo will not be changed or altered for a minimum period of five years.
 - c. A redesigned logo must follow the same process as a new logo.
3. Apparatus/station logos/patches can be worn on the following uniforms.
 - i. Job Shirts – right sleeve
 - ii. Screen print – T-Shirt
 1. The apparatus/station logo shall be located on the left breast of the t-shirt no larger than the current MFD Maltese Cross
 2. Any other use of the apparatus/station Logo will be approved by the Fire Chief prior to any application/use.
