Addressing Resident Questions: Property Taxes, E-Cigarette Recycling, and Staying Informed

We've received several questions from residents recently, and we want to take a moment to share updates on a few of the most frequently asked topics.

Impact of Proposed Property Tax Reductions Many of you have expressed concerns about how

proposed property tax reductions being considered at



the state level could impact local services. At the time of writing, the Indiana General Assembly is still in session, and the outcome remains uncertain. However, please know that we

are not waiting for answers—we've been working proactively with our financial advisors since fall 2024, and with department heads since early 2025, to identify potential replacement revenue streams and cost-saving strategies. Maintaining the high level of service our community expects remains our top priority, and we are preparing for a variety of outcomes.

Proper Disposal of E-Cigarettes

Another important issue raised by residents involves recycling ecigarettes. These devices contain hazardous materials and should never be placed in your household trash or recycling bins. Instead, please take



used e-cigarettes to a household hazardous waste **collection site** for safe disposal. Proper handling protects our sanitation workers, prevents fires, and helps keep our environment safe. See page 4 for schedule.

DRAIN GRATES

Now that Spring Leaf Collection has ended, spring rains can cause flooding of yards and streets. Most of the time flooding can be prevented by making sure the drain grates are kept free of debris. It doesn't take much to clog a drain and have it cause significant flooding of streets and/o



it cause significant flooding of streets and/or yards.

As material such as leaves, twigs, and litter are washed from the ground surface it collects onto the drain grating and acts like a rubber plug. The flow of water runoff into the drainage system is drastically reduced when material collects near or on the drain grate. Residents can do their part by helping keep drains near your home free of debris.

- Public Works offers free wood chips on the first Saturday of the month, 8 am Noon, May through October. Bring your own shovel and something to put the wood chips in.
- Branch Collection: Branches should be no longer than 7' long and 5" in diameter. Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small branches should be bundled and tied; these will be picked up with your garbage. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at 836-6970 or 6971.
