Munster Sustainability Committee

Over the past several months, members of the Munster Town Council have held a series of meetings with residents, including students from Munster High School, to explore the formation of a Sustainability Committee. The goal of this Committee is to assist the Munster community in researching, educating, and implementing sustainable solutions that benefit both current and future residents.

To achieve this, discussions have focused on the following key objectives:

- Promote existing services, programs, events, and efforts that support the health, well-being, and environmental sustainability of our community.
- Assist in Researching programs, services, events, and grant opportunities to identify and implement sustainable practices that are practical and communityfocused.
- Introduce, educate, and partner with various stakeholders, including the Town of Munster, the School Town of Munster, businesses, homeowner associations, and local organizations, to raise awareness and provide access to sustainable ideas and initiatives.

In alignment with these efforts, the Munster Town Council has adopted a resolution formally establishing the Munster Sustainability Committee and approving the framework to guide its work.

Highlights of the Adopted Resolution:

- The Committee is officially established as a recognized body to promote and support sustainability within the Town of Munster.
- Purpose: To build upon the Town's ongoing commitment to sustainable solutions by promoting existing programs, supporting new initiatives, and improving collaboration with residents and regional partners.
- Expected Benefits: Stronger intergenerational engagement, improved quality of life, enhanced economic and environmental resilience, and a more connected and attractive community for residents, students, and businesses.

dedicated budget and will focus on solutions that are
either self-funded or available at low or no cost to the
Town

In the coming months, the Town will continue working with residents, the School Town of Munster, and the Munster Chamber of Commerce to launch this committee and begin its work.


CAR SEAT SAFETY CHECK EVENT


MUNSTER'S 30TH ANNUAL NATIONAL NIGHT OUT CELEBRATION **TUESDAY, AUGUST 5TH**

The Munster Police Department and Choice Community Council invite and encourage all Munster residents to participate in Munster's 30th Annual National Night Out Celebration on Tuesday, August 5th. This fun and exciting annual event for all ages is held each year to ____ promote safety in our community as well as positive police and community partnerships. The event will begin with a Community Parade at 4:30pm on Columbia Avenue from Park
Drive to the south lot of Munster High School, consisting of school groups, emergency
vehicles, veterans, and more. Please line the sides of the street to show your support and then follow the parade to the main event.

REGULATIONS FOR FIREWOKS

Per Munster Ordinance 1834, consumer fireworks may be discharged within Town limits only on the following dates and times:

* June 19: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight * June 29 – July 3 & July 5 – July 9: 5:00 p.m. to 11:00 pm. * July 4: 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight

A violation of this ordinance carries a \$100 fine per occurrence.

ELECTRIFYING MUNSTER 2025

Beauty & the Box Program ~ Program Overview

The Munster Civic Foundation (MCF) is excited to announce a new, multi-year, town-wide, public beautification project called "ELECTRIFYING MUNSTER - Beauty & the Box".

This new initiative will target the 33 electrical boxes the Town owns (located near stop-light intersections) for esthetic enhancement. The MCF is reaching out to local entities and residents to sponsor each box and work with a graphic artist to create original artwork to decorate it with a vinyl wrap. Munster residents, local businesses, as well as Munster-based civic and not-for-profit organizations will have the opportunity to select and sponsor any of the available electrical boxes around town. Through the end of 2025, the sponsorship price of each box will be \$2,000 - \$2,500 per box. The sponsorship prices included

production and installation of the graphics. Each sponsor will retain their box for two years once

installation is completed.

The **Munster Civic Foundation** is dedicated to supporting projects and events that promote, foster, and encourage community spirit and pride. Created in 1990 through an endowment from the Community Foundation of Northwest Indiana, the **MCF** has spent more than three decades funding various projects such as the sponsorship of the July 3rd fireworks, purchasing flags and holiday decorations, contributing to the first bike paths, and assisting the 2008 flood victims.
