#### The Last Days of Summer and Looking Ahead

#### **School Zone Safety**

The end of the dog days of summer are upon us, and nothing signals that more clearly than the return of students to school in mid-August. As school zones become active again, please



be extra alert when driving as many ongoing construction projects around Town may impact traffic in and around these areas. Drivers, watch closely for children crossing the street, and kids, please use crosswalks and stay alert. Safety is everyone's responsibility.

#### **Budgeting for 2026**

While families are gearing up for new routines and fall activities, the Clerk-Treasurer's Office is deep into preparing the 2026 Town Budget. This year's process brings unique challenges due to the impact of State Senate Enrolled Act 1 (SEA 1), which was signed into law during the most recent Indiana legislative session. SEA 1 significantly affects municipal finances, particularly property tax revenue.

Thankfully, Munster has a long-standing tradition of being



fiscally conservative. However, we've always operated leanly, which makes it more difficult to identify areas to cut or adjust without impacting the high level of service our residents have become accustomed to. That's why we began planning early as discussions started last fall.

Since then, we've closely followed the law's development, attended numerous workshops hosted by the State and financial experts, and even our local engineering firm. We have consulted with our advisors, department heads, peer communities, and our professional organizations. We've gathered an array of insights and ideas, and we're now evaluating solutions with the goal of maintaining service levels, retaining our dedicated staff, and keeping Munster a great place to live and work.

In the coming months, we'll present potential options to the Town Council and department heads for input and possible implementation. While challenges lie ahead, I'm confident that by working together, we'll continue to move forward and remain Munster Strong.




