We're proud to highlight the incredible work of Munster Parks and Recreation, a department dedicated to creating vibrant spaces and meaningful experiences for all who call Munster home. From scenic green spaces to engaging community programs, their efforts continue to enhance the quality of life for residents of all ages.



The team manages 345 acres of property, including 30 parks, 19 playgrounds, and miles of trails for walking and



biking. Amenities also include a 9-hole golf course, disc golf course, community pool, the Lions Club Social Center, 17 picnic shelters, entertainment stage, fitness stairs, and a treasured historical museum. Sports and recreation are well supported

with 20 ball fields, 15 tennis courts, 7 basketball courts, 4 volleyball courts, 4 pickleball courts, several soccer fields, and a cricket pitch.

Beyond these facilities, the department offers a packed calendar of events throughout the year. Seasonal highlights include Cruisin' the Ridge, the Family



Bike Ride, Munster Monarch Fest, Cash for Clutter Community Garage Sale, Movies in the Park, and Community Concerts, all designed to bring neighbors together and

celebrate community spirit.

We encourage everyone to take full advantage of the many opportunities Munster Parks and Recreation provides. Whether it's a peaceful trail walk, joining a league, or attending a special event. These shared experiences are what make Munster such a special place to live, work, and play.

From Trapper Keepers to Traffic Safety: A Back-to-School Reminder

Back-to-school season always stirs up a little nostalgia. The thrill of picking out the perfect Trapper Keeper, the sparkle of



Lisa Frank folders, the scent of a brand-new box of Crayola crayons, and maybe a little dried Elmer's glue on our fingertips. Mornings filled with cereal commercials and Ray Rayner, lunchboxes that matched our personalities, and

afternoons spent plunking out "Chopsticks" on the piano or tuba.

I am now thinking about crosswalks, flashing lights, and ways we can help to get our kids get to school safely. The new school year has its excitement, but it comes with a heightened sense of responsibility.

Munster takes school zone safety seriously, and this year we've invested in upgrades that will make our roadways safer for students. You may have already noticed new school zone signage and road marking near all of our elementary, middle, and high schools, as well as private schools. These are designed to catch your attention, and they work best when you pay attention to them.

Additional flashing lights are on order and will be installed at key crossings to remind drivers to slow down and remain alert. These are our reminders to drive with caution and stay alert in all marked school zones.

As you drive through Town heading to work, the gym, juggling drop-offs, or simply running errands, kids may be crossing the street at any time. Many students arrive early for band, sports, or tutoring, and stay late for after-school programs. Just because the final bell has rung doesn't mean pedestrian traffic is over.

Talk with your children about safe ways to walk or bike to school. Always use the designated crosswalks, and where



available, cross with the help of a crossing guard. Never dart across traffic, even if you're running late. Children should be dropped off at school in the designated areas, not in traffic (even if traffic is stopped). We're working hard to create safe paths, and we need your help to

make sure those paths are used properly.

School zone signs are neon yellow-green for a reason. They are bright, bold, and meant to grab your attention don't let them fade into the background. Observe reduced speed limits. Avoid distractions. Put down the phone. Slow down when you see kids near the road. The safety of our children is a shared responsibility.



Thank you for doing your part to help every student arrive safely at school and back home again.

Safety Reminders Regarding Electric Scooters &

We have recently received several concerns regarding kids



and teens on electric scooters or electric bicycles who are not following traffic rules or who are riding past pedestrians at a high rate of speed. Please advise your children to wear a helmet and to always ride safely.

Please also remind your children that bicyclists and individuals on scooters must ALWAYS follow the same rules of the road that motor vehicles have to, including stopping at all stop lights and stop signs, and that motor vehicles have to and they should also be traveling with the flow of traffic. In addition, e-bicyclists must remember the following:

- State of IN code allows Class 1&2 e-bikes on any bicycle path in the State. Class 3 e-bikes are PROHIBITED on trails. Those allowed on Munster bike trails and connecting communities are Class 1&2 e-bikes.
- Class 1 e-bikes have an electric motor using 750 watts or less, a maximum assisted speed of 20mph, and are pedal assist only. There is no throttle.
- Class 2 e-bikes have an electric motor using 750 watts or less, a maximum assisted speed of 20mph, and are pedal assist and have a throttle so they can be ridden without pedaling.
- Class 3 e-bikes have an electric motor using 750 watts or less, a maximum assisted speed of 28mph, and are pedal assist only. There is no throttle.
- If a bike with an electric motor does not exactly meet one of these definitions, then it is not an e-bike and is considered a motorized vehicle.

The Town of Munster will be accepting Letters of Interest from qualified firms or individuals to operate the Town-owned concessions facilities at Community Park beginning in 2026.






