Year-End Community Newsletter – 2025

Dear Munster Residents,

As 2025 comes to a close, I want to personally thank you for your continued trust and engagement. This year, our Council remained focused on a clear commitment: **putting Munster residents first**. Every action we took reflected that priority, and I'm proud to share some of the major accomplishments we achieved together.

2025 Accomplishments

Hired a Permanent Town Manager

Providing consistent, professional leadership to guide long-term planning and daily operations.

• Entered a New Agreement with the School Town of Munster for IT Services

This partnership modernized outdated IT infrastructure and strengthened technology systems across both organizations.

• Issued a \$20 Million Water Revenue Bond

This investment launches essential upgrades to our water utility infrastructure, ensuring dependable service for current and future residents.

• Hired a Town Social Worker

Expanding our ability to support individuals and families facing mental-health or crisis-related challenges within our community.

• Awarded the Construction Contract for the Bridges Over Ditches Project

After many years of planning, construction will begin on new pedestrian bridges over the Cady Marsh and Schoon Ditches, improving connectivity and walkability throughout town.

Completed Key Landfill Improvements

Repairs to well fields and a new leachate disposal system will enhance safety, compliance, and long-term functionality.

• Installed a New Methane-to-Electricity Generator

This upgrade converts landfill methane into usable energy, reducing emissions and improving efficiency.

• Continued Paving and Watermain Improvements

Several streets received new pavement and upgraded watermains this year. (A full list of completed streets will be provided by Bob.)

Looking Ahead to 2026

With the foundation we've built in 2025, we are entering the new year with strong momentum. In 2026, the Council will continue to prioritize transparency, responsible investment, and resident-focused decision-making. We remain committed to ensuring Munster stays a safe, vibrant, and forward-moving community.

Happy New Year, Munster!

The beginning of a new year allows us to reflect on the past while also planning for the year ahead. Councilor Shinkan focused his article on the Town's accomplishments in 2025. I wanted to share a few additional items from 2025 that have come up in conversations with residents, along with a bit about 2026.

Town of Munster app (we don't have one anymore)

Twice recently, the Town of Munster app was mentioned. The app was once used to allow residents to report issues such as potholes or streetlights that were out. The Town did have such an app; however, only a small number of residents used it, and we struggled to respond to submissions in a timely manner. The decision was made to discontinue the app several years ago. The app was replaced with a reporting link on the Town website, which was also used very infrequently and has since been discontinued. Currently, if you have an issue to report, please contact 219-836-6900. This number connects to the Town's phone tree and will route you to the appropriate department.

December events you can look forward to seeing again in 2026

This past December, we kicked off the winter season with the Munster Civic Foundation lighting Town Hall and sharing hot chocolate prior to the December 1 Council meeting. The following weekend, the Parks Department hosted an Arts and Crafts Show; Santa visited the Kaske House, hosted by the Munster Historical Society; the Munster Education Foundation's annual holiday house and neighborhood light competition kicked off; Community Choice Council holiday trees were decorated at Town Hall; and the Munster Chamber's Shop Small event brought thousands of dollars to local merchants. These events contribute to the success of Munster and reflect the Town pride we share. Please plan to look for them again in 2026, and we invite your participation.

2026

The South Shore Train is coming in 2026, with trains expected to begin running in March of 2026. Final preparations are underway, including test runs and landscaping.

The Town will host NICTD for Coffee with the Councilors (and the Clerk-Treasurer) on Wednesday, January 21, at 6:00 pm in the Main Meeting Room at Munster Town Hall. NICTD will provide a presentation, and residents will have the opportunity to ask questions about upcoming train services. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

The Clerk-Treasurer's Office evaluated office traffic over the past three months. Due to few office visits or phone calls after 4:00 pm, and in an effort to improve office efficiency, the Clerk-Treasurer's Office will close at 4:00 pm each day. The office will continue to open at 7:30 am each morning and we offer multiple options for residents to pay utility bills or conduct other business. Town Hall will remain open during its current hours. After-hours water emergencies should be reported to 219-802-9693, and street emergencies can be reported at 219-802-6531.

This past year was a good one for me, as I had the opportunity to travel and my family grew with the addition of an incredible daughter-in-law. I can only hope that 2026 will be just as wonderful, both personally and professionally. MUNSTER'S 2025 NATIONAL NIGHT OUT EVENT RANKS #1 IN THE UNITED STATES!

In late November, the Munster Police Department was notified that this past year's National Night Out Celebration which was held in Munster on August 5th was ranked by the National Association of Town Watch as the #1 National Night Out event in the United States for our population category of 15,000-50,000 people (there are only six population categories). The National Night Out is held in approximately 16,000 communities throughout the United States each year, with millions of people participating, to promote positive police and community partnerships through a variety of both fun and educational activities for all ages. For ranking #1, Munster will be receiving the National Night Out Cup (a trophy) to display in town.

This achievement would not have been possible without the great support of many businesses, school groups, community organizations, faith-based groups, town employees, and residents who either volunteered their time, set up booths, provided donations, or actively participated in the event that evening to help make this past year's National Night Out the best one yet. Thank you and congratulations to our community.
