WESTLAKE PARK - PHASE I

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS FROM THE MUNSTER POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Munster Police Department encourages residents to remember the following safety tips in an effort to help protect themselves and their property during the summer months:

- 1. Always lock your vehicle and never leave items such as purses, wallets, laptops, GPS units, or briefcases in plain view inside your vehicle.
- 2. Do not leave your purse or wallet inside your unlocked vehicle while paying for gas. Some thieves wait around gas stations watching for people who do this.
- 3. If you are going on vacation, notify the police department with your name, address, and emergency contact information. You should also talk to one or more trusted neighbors and ask them to look after your residence or pick up your mail while you are away.
- 4. Talk to your children about strangers and be careful about where you allow them to go on their own, even if it is a short distance. Remember that most children are kidnapped within a short distance from home.
- 5. Join your local Neighborhood Crime Watch group by logging on to www.munster.org/police and providing the appropriate information. You can also set up a group if you do not have one in your area.

CRIME PREVENTION/SAFETY TIP

When shopping in stores, always keep your purses zipped up and over your shoulder to help prevent wallet or purse thefts. For men, it's a good idea to keep your wallet in your front pocket to prevent pick-pocketing attempts. If you are shopping and someone asks you to read a can for them or bumps into you, immediately check for someone attempting to sneak up behind you. If you believe that someone is attempting to steal from you or another customer, notify the store personnel immediately or dial 911.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING PLACEMENT & PICK UP INFORMATION

As a reminder, Able Disposal collects the garbage and recycling throughout the town. Their scheduled hours of pick up are from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm. Please have your garbage and recycling out no later than 6:00 am on your regular pick up day.

Garbage and recycling containers should be placed out for collection **NO EARLIER** than noon on the day preceding your collection day. Emptied containers must be **returned to the premises at the end of your collection day**.

Please make sure your trash is in a container and the container has a tight fitting top (as required by town code) so animals cannot scatter garbage all over the street. If you need a new garbage container, you may rent one from Able Disposal at 1-800-828-2253

If your recycling bin is lost, damaged, or you would like an additional bin, you may purchase one at the Clerk-Treasurer's Office in the Munster Town Hall. The fee for a new recycling bin is \$8.25. If you have any questions, contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.

THE PROPER WAY TO DISPOSE OF...

Computers & Electronics—Starting January 1, 2011, Indiana Law prohibits putting electronics into the garbage. The Munster Public Works Department now has a recycling container for electronics located at the Public Works garage, 508 Fisher Street, in the recycling area to the right of the driveway.

Ink Cartriges—If you would like to recycle your ink cartridges, you may take them to be refilled at Cartridge World located at 8124 Calumet Avenue, Munster, and can be reached at 513-0565 or **www.cartridgeworldusa.com**.

Latex Paint—Latex paint can be put into your regular garbage IF IT IS COMPLETELY DRIED OUT. You will need to take the top off and put either kitty litter or sand into the paint and let it sit out for a couple days until it dries. Once it is dried out, you may place it in the garbage. If it is not dry, the paint will splatter down your street once the hopper compresses on the garbage truck. PLEASE MAKE SURE THE PAINT IS COMPLETELY DRIED OUT.

You may take latex paint for recycling to the City of Hobart yard 340 S. Shelby Street, Hobart. Drop off times are: Monday—Friday 7:00 am to 2:45 pm, Saturdays 8:00 am to 11:45 am. Any question call Hobart City yard at 219-942-6121.

Oil Based Paint & Solvents—Oil based paint and solvents must be taken to a household hazardous waste pick up.

Large Items (Sofas, Furniture, Mattresses, etc.) - Able Disposal will pick up **ONE** large item each week with your regular garbage. You do not need to call in for a pick up.

Carpet—Carpet must be cut down into small pieces, approximately five feet by five feet pieces, rolled and bound with tape or string, and put at the curbside or alley for Able Disposal to

pick up on your regular pick up day. If the carpet is not bound, it will not be picked up.

CHARGE PILES

The Town charges to pick up large piles of garbage, debris, and yard waste. If the Street Department determines the pile is excessive, the minimum charge to pick it up is \$125. If it is determined to be a charge pile, a letter will be left on your door and the letter must be signed and returned before your pile will be picked up. If you have any questions, contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.

BRANCHES AND YARD WASTE

Branches will be picked up by the Public Works Department with the chipper. Branches should not be longer than five feet. Pick up will begin Mondays on the North end of town and work south during the week. In the spring when there is a large volume of branches there may be times when town crews may be delayed because of storms and their aftermath, resulting in collection running up to one week behind. Please be patient, we will get to your branches. YOU DO NOT NEED TO CALL FOR BRANCH PICK UP. The Town has two chippers out on the streets which go down every street in town.

Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small branches should be bundled and tied. These bundled twigs and yard waste will be picked up by Able Disposal on your regular collection day. LEAVES ARE NOT CONSIDERED YARD WASTE. If you have any questions, contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.

TREES IN PARKWAY AND EASEMENT

Responsibility of Property Owners

The responsibility for the purchase, planting, maintenance, and removal of all trees and shrubs growing in the parkway shall be that of the property owner, but this does not limit the Town's authority to have such work performed. It is the responsibility of each property owner to keep such trees properly trimmed to a proper height so as not to interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic and to remove dead limbs that may be doing damage to the buildings or property of either his/her own or his/her neighbor's property. Property owners are also responsible for the care of trees needed, including treatment of any type of tree disease.

No person shall plant, move, brace, perform any surgery work, or cut any tree or shrub in the parkway of the town without receiving permission from the Public Works Department.

Once permission is received, if a contractor is hired to perform any work, or cut down a tree, the contractor is required to be licensed by the Town. The contractor shall also be responsible to haul away all debris from the site. THE TOWN WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE TO CLEAN UP DEBRIS FROM A CONTRACTOR.
