Smoke Alarms Life-Saving Tips

For increased protection, USFA recommends installing both ionization (detects fast-burning fires) and photoelectric (detects slow, smoldering fires), or dual sensor smoke alarms in the home per manufacturers' installation instructions and applicable codes.

Place a smoke alarm on every level of your home and outside bedrooms. If you keep your bedroom doors closed, place a smoke alarm in each bedroom

Check smoke alarms monthly by pushing the test button. If you cannot reach the button easily, use a broom handle.

Change the batteries in your alarms at least once a year – perhaps when you change your clocks for Daylight Savings Time.

Teach children what the smoke alarm sounds like and what to do - leave the building immediately by crawling low under the smoke – when they hear it sound.

If cooking smoke sets off the alarm, do not disable it. Turn on the range fan, open a window or wave a towel near the alarm.

Do not remove the batteries to put in other appliances such as personal stereos or games.

Smoke alarms wear out over time. Replace yours if it is 10 years old or more

Keep smoke alarms clean. Dust and debris can interfere with their operation. Vacuum over and around your smoke alarm regularly.

Consider installing a 10 year lithium battery-powered smoke alarm, which is sealed so it cannot be tampered with or opened.



MUNSTER'S FIREWORKS ORDINANCE

Munster's Fireworks Ordinance states that consumer fireworks may be discharged within the corporate limits of Munster from June 29th through July 3rd, and from July 5th through July 9th between the hours of 5:00 pm and two hours after sunset. On July 4th, fireworks can be discharged in between the hours of 10 am and midnight.

Please note, however, that fireworks must be discharged on your own property (not in the street or parks) or on the property of someone who has given you permission. You must also be 18 years of age to possess or discharge fireworks unless accompanied by a supervising adult. Please be safe and respectful of your neighbors (and their properties) when discharging fireworks.

Violators of this ordinance can be fined by the Munster Police Department. If you need to report a possible violation of this ordinance, please contact the station at 836-6600 and attempt to provide an exact address of where the violation is occurring from.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS FROM THE **MUNSTER POLICE DEPARTMENT**

Mosquitoes are an all too familiar summer nuisance. They are The Munster Police Department encourages all residents to not only annoying, but they can be transmitters of West Nile, follow these important safety tips throughout the summer: encephalitis, malaria and yellow fever to humans, virus and 1. Talk with your children about strangers, and advise them to heartworms to pets. stay near you at all times when in stores or parks.

2. Report suspicious individuals in your neighborhood, the parks, at the pool, or in the business districts immediately. Remember that if something doesn't feel right to you, it probably isn't.

3. When at the pool or parks, keep your vehicles locked up and remove all valuables from plain view. When at the pool, make use of the available lockers and never leave your car keys, wallet or purse lying around or hidden underneath a towel. 4. When attending summer parties, if you choose to consume alcohol, please do so responsibly and always use a designated driver.

5. If you are going on vacation, let the Munster Police Department know along with your trusted neighbors know that you'll be gone and encourage your neighbors to report anyone on your property immediately. Do not post on social media sites that you'll be on vacation.

CHARGE PILES

The Town charges to pick up large piles of garbage, debris and vard waste. If the Street Department determines the pile is excessive, the minimum charge to pick it up is \$130. If it is determined to be a charge pile, a letter will be left on your door and the letter must be signed and returned before your pile will be picked up. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at 836-6971.

WHITE GOODS

The Town will pick up white goods on Wednesdays. White goods are washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers, dishwashers, microwaves and hot water heaters. If you have a white good to be picked up, please call the Town of Munster Public Works Department at 836-6971 and give us your address. All other large items can be put out for Waste Management to pick up on your regular garbage pick up day. Waste Management will pick up one large item a week in addition to your regular garbage.

WOOD CHIPS

Town of Munster residents can pick up free wood chips at the Public Works Garage, 508 Fisher Street, Monday thru Friday, 7:30 am to 2:30 pm. You will also be able to pick up free wood chips on the first Saturday of the month, weather permitting, starting in May through September, between the hours of 8:00 am to 12:00 noon. It is the responsibility of the resident to transport their own wood chips. You will be required to show proof of residency. MOSQUITO CONTROL

The Town of Munster is using the safest mosquito products available to control mosquitoes. We will put briquets in all areas where there is standing water to kill the mosquitoes before they hatch. We will spray to kill the adult population of

mosquitoes. Usually we spray in the evening hours between 10:00 pm and 7:00 am, when the weather conditions fall into a favorable pattern. The pesticide we apply has no odor and is harmless to humans and pets.

You can take simple, positive steps to reduce this menace right at home, since many generations of mosquitoes can breed right in your own yard.

- Get rid of old tires, tin cans, buckets, drums, bottles or any water holding containers
- Fill in or drain any low places (puddles, ruts) in yard
- Keep drains, ditches and culverts clean of weeds and trash • so water will drain properly
- Cover trash containers to keep out rain water
- Repair leaky pipes and outside faucets
- Empty plastic wading pool at least once a week and store it • indoors when not in use
- Make sure your backyard pool is properly cared for while on vacation
 - Fill in tree rot holes and hollow stumps that hold water with sand or concrete
 - Change the water in bird baths and plant pots or drip travs at least once each week
- Keep grass cut short and shrubbery well trimmed around the house so adult mosquitoes will not hide there
- The residents of Munster should take precautions for themselves and their children when they go out in areas where they may become exposed to mosquitoes.

What can you do to reduce your risk of being bitten by mosquitoes

- Stay indoors at dawn, dusk and in the early evening.
- Wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants whenever you are outdoors.
- Spray clothing with repellents containing permethrin or DEET since mosquitoes may bite through the clothing.
- Apply insect repellent sparingly to exposed skin. An effective repellent will contain 35% DEET. Deet in high concentrations (greater than 35%) provides no additional protection.
- Repellents may irritate the eyes and mouth, so avoid applying repellent to the hands of children.
- Whenever you use insecticide or insect repellent, be sure to read and follow the manufacturer's DIRECTIONS FOR USE, as printed on the product.
