### FIRE PREVENTION WEEK & OPEN HOUSE

The Munster Fire Department would like to announce its annual Fire Prevention Week and Open House! Fire Prevention Week is October 5<sup>th</sup> through the 15<sup>th</sup>. The theme for the Week is **“Don’t Wait – Check the date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years!”** During this week, firefighters visit the local schools to bring the prevention week theme and fire safety awareness to the students.

On Saturday, October 15, 2016, the Munster Fire Department will be hosting its annual Fire Prevention Week Open House. The event, which runs from 11 am – 3:30 pm, is FREE and open to the public. Fire Station No. 2, located at 550 Fisher Street, will host the event, as in years past. We encourage all residents of Munster and surrounding communities to attend and bring their families & friends. There is something to do for everyone. Some of the events for the day include: Antique fire engine rides, live extrication demonstrations, fire safety house, informational displays, hands-on training with a fire hose, free literature, door prizes, food, a live house fire demonstration and much more!

The live house fire demonstration is at 3 pm. An actual 12' x 12' furnished room will be set on fire, to show the rapid spread and the devastating effects that fire can have on a structure and its contents. The importance of leaving a building and not returning during a fire as well as getting out as fast and safely as possible will also be some important safety messages stressed during our demonstration.

## BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY TIPS

Parents are asked to remember the following safety tips as we begin our new school year:

- Please follow the proper drop-off and pick-up procedures for your child's school to ensure a smoother process for everyone. Never leave your vehicle parked along the curb or in the pick-up line, and do not pick up or drop off your child in unauthorized areas.
- Be patient when picking up or dropping off your children and never drive around lines or cut through parking lots.
- Please be aware of children and parents who are crossing at intersections or walking out from behind vehicles. Slow down in school zones (20 mph speed limit) and always yield to pedestrians. Avoid using electronic devices while you are in school zones and keep music turned down so that you can remain alert for what is going on around you.
- Please speak with children who walk to school about strangers and about how to react if they are approached or if they get lost. Always make sure to accompany small children to school for their safety.
- Be aware that you **MUST** stop for school bus stop arms, unless there is an unimproved median or barrier in the center of the street. Even on multi-lane streets such as Ridge Road, you **MUST** stop for the safety of the children boarding or departing from the bus. School bus drivers have been trained to report violators to the Munster Police Department.

The Munster Police Department maintains directed school zone patrols during arrival and dismissal and will issue citations for individuals who are speeding or disregarding crossing guards, stop signs, or other signage.

Make sure to avoid parking in handicapped zones, which is punishable by a fine. Please leave these spaces for people who need to use them.

Please report individuals who are driving recklessly in the school zones immediately by calling 911 along with a description of the vehicle and/or license plate. Any ongoing safety issues should be reported to your child's principal or the appropriate school resource officer (Officer James Ghrist, elementary schools, 219-836-6639, or Officer Joe Pacheco, middle/high schools, 219-836-6629).

## TEMPORARY SIGNS

As election season approaches, the Town of Munster wishes to remind all residents of restrictions pertaining to temporary yard signs. As per Section 26-1025 of the Munster Town code, a property owner is not required to obtain a permit for a yard sign on residential property. The maximum area for a yard sign is 4 sq. ft. Yard signs shall not be located within the public right-of-way and are required to be placed a minimum of 5 ft. from the public right-of-way. Up to three yard signs are allowed per parcel at any one time. Town officials will be enforcing these regulations and issuing notices of violation as needed.

## HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)

Lake County Solid Waste Management District has a program for residents of Lake County to dispose of household hazardous waste. Any question on the Household Hazardous Waste pick up should be directed to Lake County Solid Waste Management District at 219-769-3820.

## MOSQUITO CONTROL IN MUNSTER

Each year, the Town of Munster takes an integrated approach to controlling the mosquito population. The combined efforts of the Town and residents are key to reducing populations. Two mosquito-borne illnesses of concern for Indiana residents are West Nile Virus and Zika Virus. Please see the tips below for how you can assist in controlling mosquito populations and reducing your risk of bites.

### Help Eliminate Mosquitoes in Your Yard

Empty, remove, cover, or turn over receptacles with the potential to hold water. Clean bird baths twice weekly. Discard old tires or store them indoors. Repair leaky plumbing and outside faucets. Make sure gutters and downspouts are free of blockage and are properly draining. Fill holes in trees with sand. Empty your pets' water dishes daily. Drain or fill low areas on your property that hold water for more than three days.

### Ways to Reduce Mosquito Bites

Wear light-colored clothing, long-sleeved shirts or jackets and long slacks. Avoid mosquito-infested areas or stay indoors when mosquitoes are most active. Avoid physical exertion and use colognes and perfumes sparingly, as these may attract mosquitoes. Use mosquito repellent, according to directions, when you are outdoors. It is generally recommended that adults use products with 30% or less DEET. Children should use products with 10% or less DEET. You can also use products containing picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus as repellents. These products typically provide longer-lasting protection.
