HOLIDAY SEASON SAFETY TIPS

If you are leaving town, please contact the Munster Police Department's Records Division at 219-836-6650 and provide your name, address, when you'll be gone, and any other helpful information.

- If you'll be out of town for a while, ask a friend or neighbor to shovel snow or to park a car in your driveway.
- Keep your home well-lit during the evening hours, using dusk to dawn and motion-detecting lighting. Keep shrubs trimmed below the window line to help eliminate hiding places for burglars.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash while shopping, and only take necessary credit cards.
- Carry your wallet in your front pocket while shopping, and sling your purse (zipped up) in front of you to help prevent pickpocket attempts. Never leave your purse hanging behind you on a restaurant chair, or in a shopping basket.
- Store purchased items in the trunk of your vehicle and do not place shopping bags in plain view inside of your vehicle. This encourages thefts.
- Shop with a friend, and carpool together. If you walk out to a dark parking lot and are afraid to walk to your vehicle, you can call 911 to request an escort. An officer will respond when available.
- If someone attempts to rob you by taking your purse or purchased items, please give them up to prevent injury to yourself. Remember that you can replace items, but not your life.
- Be aware of individuals collecting for phony charities at your door or by phone. They could be scam artists. Never let some-one you don't know into your home, and talk to visitors through a locked storm door. Report suspicious individuals immediately and never give anyone your personal information. Only provide donations to reputable sources that you know and trust.
- If you see anything suspicious around the shopping districts or parking lots, please call 911 immediately and move to a safe location.

## 2016 FALL LEAF COLLECTION

LEAF COLLECTION PICK UP WILL BE ONCE EVERY 2 WEEKS

The Town of Munster 2016 Fall Leaf Collection will begin on Monday, October 3, 2016 and will continue through December 2, 2016, <u>weather</u> <u>permitting</u>. Leaves will be picked up between the hours of 7 am to 2 pm, Monday through Friday. The Street Department crews will begin each day where they left off the previous day. LEAF COLLECTION WILL NO LONGER BE ONCE A WEEK. PICK UP WILL BE APPROXIMATELY ONCE EVERY TWO WEEKS. State Law prohibits disposal of leaves into landfills. Therefore, leaves in bags will not be picked up by the town or Waste Management.

Collection begins each morning promptly at 7 am, please have your leaves ready for collection prior to that time. Due to the large area which must be covered each day, we will not be able to back-track into areas which have already been collected. The Town's leaf pickup route will be traveled approximately once every **2 weeks**, weather permitting. The following tips will help us continue to provide quality service:

- Place your leaves in a continuous long pile called a "WIND ROW". We will be using a leaf vacuum to collect your leaves.
- 2. If your street has curbs, place your leaves right behind the curb on the parkway grass. **Please do not place leaves in the street**. If it rains, these leaves could cover the street drains and cause unnecessary flooding.
- 3. If your street does not have curbs, place your leaves on the edge of the street pavement.
- 4. Please refrain from parking on the streets adjacent to piles of leaves between the hours of 7 am to 2 pm.
- 5. Do not place leaves around trees, sign posts, light or telephone poles.
- Do not place sticks, bricks, stones or other materials in piles of leaves. High velocity equipment is used during our removal efforts and these items can do damage to equipment or more importantly, may injure an employee or bystander.

**IMPORTANT**: <u>Leaves will not be picked up in bags</u>. Please rake leaves to parkway.

## **NEWS FOR SNOWBIRDS**

It is coming to the time of year that some of our residents may be planning their winter away from the cold and snow. If you are a part of that group, please remember a few things:

You will need to continue to pay the minimum bills. Setting up automatic payment (ACH) is the best way to be sure those bills are paid on time and the correct amount is paid. Please remember that you will be charged a late fee if an amount goes unpaid. You may call us at the beginning of any month to check the balance due.

We can also temporarily send your bills to another address if you prefer. Just let us know where to send them temporarily. And when you get back to town, call us again to have the bill sent to your local address.

If you want your water turned OFF, you must schedule a time for our maintenance staff to turn the water off (this is the only way to suspend billing). For your protection, **it must be a time when someone will be there to confirm it is off**. There is a \$20 fee to turn the service off and a \$20 fee to turn it back on. That DOES save you money if you are going to be gone for several months. Remember that we will not turn service on to an empty house, so call us one business day in advance to set an appointment time when you can either be there yourself or can have someone you trust with access to the home be there to confirm when service is turned on that there are no issues inside your home.
