The Munster Fire Department would like to announce its annual Fire Prevention Week and Open House!! Fire Prevention Week is October 7th through the 13th. The theme for the Week is **"Look.** Listen. Learn. Be Aware. Fire can happen anywhere." During this week, firefighters visit the local schools to bring the prevention week theme and fire safety awareness to the students.

On Saturday, October 13th the Munster Fire Department will be hosting its annual Fire Prevention Week Open House. The event, which runs from 11 a.m. -3:30 p.m., is free and open to the public. Fire Station No. 2, located at 550 Fisher Street, will host the event, as in years past. We encourage all residents of Munster and surrounding communities to attend and bring their families & friends. There is something to do for everyone. Some of the events for the day include: Antique fire engine rides, live extrication demonstrations, fire safety house, informational displays, hands-on training with a fire hose, free literature, door prizes, food, a live house fire demonstration and much more.

The live house fire demonstration is at 3:00 p.m. An actual 12' X 12' furnished room will be set on fire to show the rapid spread and the devastating effects that fire can have on a structure and its contents. The importance of leaving a building and not returning during a fire as well as getting out as fast and safely as possible will also be some important safety messages stressed during our demonstration.

2018 FALL LEAF COLLECTION

LEAF COLLECTION PICK UP WILL BE ONCE EVERY 2 WEEKS

The Town of Munster 2018 Fall Leaf Collection will begin on Monday, October 1, 2018 and will continue

through December 1, 2018, weather permitting. Leaves will be picked up between the hours of 7 am to 2 pm, Monday through Friday. The Street Department crews will begin each day where they left off the previous day. PICK UP WILL BE APPROXIMATELY ONCE EVERY TWO WEEKS. State Law prohibits disposal of leaves into landfills. Therefore, leaves in bags will not be picked up by the town or Waste Management.

Collection begins each morning promptly at 7 am, please have your leaves ready for collection prior to that time. Due to the large area which must be covered each day, we will not be able to back-track into areas which have already been collected.

- 1. Place your leaves in a continuous long pile called a "WIND ROW". We will be using a leaf vacuum to collect your leaves.
- 2. If your street has curbs, place your leaves right behind the curb on the parkway grass. Please do not place leaves in the street. If it rains, these leaves could cover the street drains and cause unnecessary flooding.
- 3. If your street does not have curbs, place your leaves on the edge of the street pavement.
- 4. Please refrain from parking on the streets adjacent to piles of leaves between the hours of 7 am to 2 pm.
- 5. Do not place leaves around trees, sign posts, light or telephone poles.
- 6. Do not place sticks, bricks, stones, grass or other materials in piles of leaves. High velocity equipment is used during our removal efforts and these items can do damage to equipment or more importantly, may injure an employee or bystander.

IMPORTANT: Leaves will not be picked up in bags. Please rake leaves to parkway. Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions please call the Public Works Department at 219 - 836-6971.

Drop Off and Curbside Recycling Guide



Plastic: beverage containers, shampoo & detergent bottles, margarine tubs, yogurt cups, kitty liter bins, cream cheese container, cooking oil bottles. Items that are **thrown away** are Plastic/

Polystyrene (solo cups & Styrofoam).



Paper: Food & drink cartons, CLEAN carboard (no pizza boxes), copy paper, magazines, newspapers, cereal boxes, junk mail, envelopes, and TetraPaks.



Metal: Aluminum cans, clean tin cans, steel cans, and metal caps from jars.



Glass: Bottles and jars that contained a food or drink. Rinse and separate caps!

These items are recyclable in your curbside bin or drop-off center. Nonrecyclable items create problems for facilities and cause good recyclables to go to the landfill! It is coming to the time of year that some of our residents may be planning their winter away from the cold and snow. If you are a part of that group, please remember a few things: You will need to continue to pay the minimum bills. Setting up automatic payment

(ACH) is the best way to be sure those bills are paid on time and the correct amount is paid.

- Please remember that you will be charged a late fee if an amount goes unpaid. You may call us at the beginning of any month to check the balance due. Or you may check your balance at <u>www.munster.org/</u><u>utilitybill</u>. You will need your account number and house number to see the balance on your account.*
- We can also temporarily send your bills to another address if you prefer. Just let us know where to send them temporarily. And when you get back to town, call us again to have the bill sent to your local address.
- If you want your water turned OFF, you must schedule a time for our maintenance staff to turn the water off (this is the only way to suspend billing). For your protection, it must be a time when someone will be there to confirm it is off.
- There is a \$20 fee to turn the service off and a \$20 fee to turn it back on. That DOES save you money if you are going to be gone for several months. Remember that we will not turn service on to an empty house, so call us one business day in advance to set an appointment time when you can either be there yourself or can have someone you trust with access to the home be there to confirm when service is turned on that there are no issues inside your home.
