Munster Fire Department Focus on Fire Safety: Heating Safety

There is something about the winter months and curling up with a good book by the fireplace. But did you know that heating equipment is a leading cause of home fire deaths?

With a few simple safety tips and precautions, you can prevent most heating fires from happening.

Fire Fact

Half of home heating fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February.

Be Warm and Safe this Winter

- Keep anything that can burn at least 3ft. away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a 3ft. "kid-free" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters, or central heating equipment according to local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from the home.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.

Heating Equipment Smarts

- Install wood burning stoves following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation.
- All fuel burning equipment should be vented to the outside to avoid Carbon Monoxide (CO) poisioning.

Winter Fire Safety: Keep Fire Hydrants Free of Snow

In an emergency, every second matters. Fire hydrants that are blocked ,concealed or difficult to access due to snow or ice can impede emergency fire response. Snow-covered hydrants can delay fire services, costing crucial seconds or minutes that can mean the difference between saving a structure and its inhabitants and not doing so.



- Shovel path from the street or driveway to the fire hydrant so that is visible from the road and firefighters can easily access.
- Consider enlisting others to assist in snow removal around fire hydrants.





You can Help! Residents can help during snow events by shoveling their sidewalks, removing snow around fire hydrants and storm water grates.

SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCES

Please read and remember the Town of Munster's ordinances for snow removal.

Ordinance:

It is hereby declared and proclaimed that it is necessary to the public health and safety that the streets of the town be cleared of snow, and if the clearing of snow is impeded and delayed by vehicles parked on the streets, such impediment and delay is detrimental to the public health and safety.

Whenever there has been snow of two inches or more, in order not to delay the clearing of such streets, all vehicles parked on all streets of the town, except streets in the area bounded by, but not including, Manor, Hohman, Ridge Road, and the northern town limits, shall be removed by the owner. These are the one-way streets between Manor and Ridge Road in the northwest section of town.

If such vehicles are not removed from the streets after two inches of snowfall occurs, and after ticketing, it shall be the duty of the police department of the town to forthwith employ some reputable person to remove such vehicles from the streets.

Ordinance:

The owner and/or occupant of any dwelling, building or subdivided lot or property shall keep the sidewalks in front thereof clean at all times of the year. Within 24 hours after any fall of snow or formation of ice, such snow or ice shall be removed from the sidewalks.

It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, push or deposit in any manner snow, slush or ice onto any street or sidewalk in such a manner as to impede the safe progress and movement of vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

Persons who violate this subsection are responsible for the costs incurred by the town to remove the impediment to safe progress and movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic.

If you believe that a residence or business is not following this ordinance, please contact either the Munster Police Department by calling 911 or you can report the matter to Community Service Officer Joseph Newton at 219-836-6659 for follow-up. If the situation is an extreme safety concern, always call 911.



BE PREPARED AT HOME AND AT WORK

Primary concerns are the potential loss of heat, power, telephone service and a shortage of supplies if storm conditions continue for more than a day.

Have available:

- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Battery powered NOAA Weather Radio and portable radio to receive emergency information.
- Extra food and water. High energy food, such as dried fruit or candy, and food requiring no cooking or refrigeration is best.
- Extra medicine and baby items
- First aid supplies
- Emergency heating source, such as fireplace, wood stove, etc. (learn how to use properly to prevent a fire, and also have proper ventilation).
- Fire extinguisher and smoke and CO detector (test units regularly to ensure they are working properly)
- Back up generator for your home or business.



CARRY A WINTER STORM SURVIVAL KIT

- Blankets/sleeping bags
- Flashlight with extra batteries
- First-aid kit
- Knife
- Extra clothing to keep dry
- Windshield scraper and brush
- Took kit
- Tow rope
- Booster cables
- Shovel
- High calorie, non-perishable food
- Keep your gas tank near full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines
- Try not to travel alone
- Let someone know your timetable and primary and alternate routes
- Sack of sand or cat liter
- A large empty can and plastic cover with tissues and paper towels for sanitary purposes
