PREVENTING SCAMS AT YOUR RESIDENCE

The Munster Police Department encourages residents to follow these important safety tips to help prevent scams at your residence:

- Always look out of a window before opening your door, and make sure that it is kept locked. Keep your exterior storm door, if you have one, locked as well.
- Talk to any visitors through an open window or through a locked storm door.
- Never allow anyone into your residence who you did not call yourself for service, even if they display some type of identification badge or say that it is an emergency. Call the police (911) if you are suspicious of anyone that is at your door and a responding officer will check on the situation.
- Scammers can sometimes pretend to be town or utility workers.
- Scammers will often push their way into your residence as soon as you open the door while stating that there is some type of emergency with your water or power. They will then ask you to either obtain a bucket of water for them, take you into another room or into the basement while an accomplice comes through the open front door and steals valuables.
- Scammers will often communicate through portable radios but will not always do so.
- Scammers may approach you in your yard to distract you, claiming that you need roof or siding repairs, while an accomplice goes into your house. Make sure that your home is locked up completely and that your garage door is closed when you are working in the yard. Take your house key and a cell phone with you so that you can call for help.
- Be careful about allowing strangers to do work around your house or to shovel snow. Only hire reputable companies that have a permit to work in the Town of Munster or ask known, trusted neighbors to help you with shoveling snow.
- Always report suspicious activity immediately by calling 911.



BRANCH COLLECTION

In an effort to keep the branch collection moving keep in mind the following:

- Branches should be stacked in one direction and placed in the parkway not in the street.
- Bundle into manageable piles with twine where possible to assist the crew.

BRANCH PILES WILL BE SKIPPED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- Branches or bundled piles of brush should be able to be picked up by one person, generally with a tree diameter no greater than 5" maximum if diameter is greater the pile will be skipped.
- Any branches from a professional landscaper or tree trimmer will not be picked up.
- DO NOT PARK VEHICLES in front of branch piles or the pile will be skipped.
- DO NOT MIX garbage, debris plant material with branch piles.
- Only tree branches or sticks from pruning are acceptable or the pile will be skipped. (Plant debris should be bagged for Waste Management collection)
- If your branch pile is the size of a vehicle it is a charge pile with a minimum fee of \$130 to be paid to the Town prior to collection and a tag will be left at the door.

NOTE: In the case of a storm event, any branches that are on the street or sidewalks will be picked up prior to returning to the branch collection route. Posted on the Town's website @www.munster.org under MAP CENTER is the Leaf and Branch Removal Map. This map indicates the Zones in Town to be referred to when the location of the chipper is given.

MOSQUITO CONTROL IN MUNSTER

Each year, the Town of Munster takes an integrated approach to controlling the mosquito population. The combined efforts of the Town and residents are key to reducing populations. Please see the tips below for how you can assist in controlling mosquito populations and reducing your risk of bites.

Help Eliminate Mosquitoes in Your Yard

Empty, remove, cover, or turn over receptacles with the potential to hold water. Clean bird baths twice weekly. Discard old tires or store them indoors. Repair leaky plumbing and outside faucets. Make sure gutters and downspouts are free of blockage and are properly draining. Fill holes in trees with sand. Empty your pets' water dishes daily. Drain or fill low areas on your property that hold water for more than three days.

Ways to Reduce Mosquito Bites

Wear light-colored clothing, long-sleeved shirts or jackets and long slacks. Avoid mosquito-infested areas or stay indoors when mosquitoes are most active. Avoid physical exertion and use colognes and perfumes sparingly, as these may attract mosquitoes. Use mosquito repellent, according to directions, when you are outdoors. It is generally recommended that adults use products with 30% or less DEET. Children should use products with 10% or less DEET. You can also use products containing picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus as repellents. These products typically provide longer-lasting protection.




UN-USED MEDICATION DROP-OFF BOX NOW AT MUNSTER PD
