Did you know that property taxes are not used to pay for the town fireworks? Nor are public monies used to pay for the holiday lights that line our main streets and

the displays at public buildings each December. The flags on the light posts are not paid for from our town resources either.

For thirty years, these costs have been covered by our very own Munster Civic Foundation. This foundation was started in 1991 by a gift from the Community Foundation, parent corporation of Community Hospital. The interest from this gift has been used to pay for items that simply make Munster a nicer place to live.

In addition to the fireworks, holiday decorations, and flags, the Munster Civic Foundation contributed to many projects you may see on a regular basis. The Munster Civic Foundation has made contributions that helped to make the Veteran's Memorial, the "new" Munster pool possible. We contributed to public art and helped to fund the first bike paths throughout town. We helped those affected by the 2008 flood, we support numerous local organizations, and we provide sponsorship to various events for the Town. The Munster Civic Foundation has made a positive impact on the quality of life in Munster.

The non-partisan board of directors would welcome your support. We are reviewing future projects that may include bike racks, summer concerts (maybe Jazz and Blues Fest reborn), a winter festival and a public art project.

From the Clerk-Treasurer's Desk

We are working on getting the funding to make capital improvements in 2021. We have earmarked the money to be used on a variety of capital improvements throughout Town. The money is distributed based on the needs of the departments and their update and replacement schedules. Public Works plans to continue making sidewalk improvements, replace some high mileage vehicles, and acquire other large pieces of equipment like an additional message board and an industrial pressure washer. The Parks Department will have funding to do systemwide improvements. We expect to upgrade some technologies in the Police Department which will include the addition of body cameras for the police force.

The Clerk-Treasurer's office will be upgrading our financial software. The upgrades will provide some needed improvements in the efficiency of processes and reporting. The software will provide improvements and additional capabilities for our Building Department. The kick-off meeting was held at the end of October and we expect the software to be fully functional in the fall of 2021. The Munster Fire Department would like to announce that the department has received an upgraded ISO (Insurance Service Office) classification.

Over the past 15 years the ISO rating for the department has been a Class 4. This year the department received an upgraded

score to a Class 3. This upgraded score is proof that the department has improved in all areas of fire service and prevention.

The new rating may decrease annual insurance premiums for residential and commercial property owners within the town service area. Policyholders can contact insurance providers to determine how the new classification will impact premiums.

Waste Management has provided a green cart with yellow lid for recycling. This means you can put all your recyclables together, no sorting needed. Recycling is picked up every other week depending if you are in a GOLD area or a GREEN area. Items for recycling are:

- Aluminum
- Tin •
- Chipboard and boxboard (Empty cereal and cracker boxes)
- Brown paper bags
- Phone books, books, catalogs and magazines
- Newspapers
- Paper cardboard, dairy and juice containers
- Junk mail including envelopes
- Glass bottles and jars
- Office and school paper
- Cardboard (Collapse boxes/cut large boxes down to 3'x3')
- Plastic bottles and container #1-#5

Items that cannot be recycled:

- Candy wrappers
- Carbon paper
- Cloth
- Food-soiled cardboard
- Food or any organic waste
- Liquids
- Plastic bags and clear plastic wrap

HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS FROM THE **MUNSTER POLICE DEPARTMENT**

- Carry your wallet in your front pocket, or your purse zipped up and slung in front of you while shopping. Do not carry large amounts of cash or unnecessary credit cards.
- Be alert for pickpockets who will often distract or bump you while an accomplice steals your wallet from your pocket or purse. Never place your purse in your shopping basket.
- If you need a safety escort to your vehicle after shopping, talk with a store manager or call 911 to request one.
- Help to prevent thefts from vehicles by placing purchased items in your trunk and out of plain view.
- Keep your home well-lit during the evening, making use of dusk to dawn and motion-detecting lights. Keep landscaping trimmed.

munsterpolicerecords@munster.org to make our police department aware. Never post anything on social media or your front door advising that you will be or are out of town.

- Be aware of anyone who calls you or comes to your door asking for donations for individuals in need. Only provide donations directly to charities that you know and trust. Never give your personal information, social security number, or bank account information over the phone to someone you do not know.
- Be aware of strangers asking to shovel your snow. Only allow trusted persons, or companies that are licensed to perform work in our town and never allow strangers into your home.

Report suspicious individuals in your neighborhood or the business districts immediately by calling 911.
