Here is hoping that we are seeing some May flowers in Town by the time you receive this newsletter. I am certainly thinking warm thoughts, because as I write this, there is snow outside my office window.

Last month we discussed the rate changes that we will see for water and solid waste that will take effect this summer, as well as the broader cost of providing reliable and safe water, storm, and sewer utilities in the future.

I'd like to take a moment to circle back to that conversation and highlight a very reasonable question that often comes up during these conversations: "But don't my property taxes pay for that?" As a resident myself, I am well aware of the property tax responsibilities we all share.

In the broadest of strokes, it costs about \$55 million to run the Town with all our services at their current level. We receive roughly the same amount in revenue, annually. However only 15% - 20% of that revenue comes from your property taxes. The rest comes from fees, utility bills, charges for service, and other sources.

A good example of this would be the Solid Waste Fee we pay every month. This fee not only covers the cost of trash and recycling, but also our leaf and branch collection. The Homewood Disposal contract will cost \$1.74 million per year. Leaf and branch collection will cost just over \$500,000 during the same period of time. This represents an annual cost of operations of \$2.25 million. Our current revenue at our current rate is \$1.83 million per year. This is a shortfall of over \$400,000. Without a fee increase, we would not be able to offer leaf and branch collection in a manner even remotely similar to our current level of service.

Munster prides itself on offering an outstanding quality of life. There are many factors that contribute to that quality of life – from the strength of civic institutions, our communities of faith, our exceptional schools to the civil Town itself. All of these require a combination of our time, treasure, and talents to live up to their potential. We are what makes us great, and I thank you for it

Exciting times here in the Clerk-Treasurer's office as all the efforts to upgrade our software over the past year will be completed this summer.

The current Town software had become challenging to use and was often just clunky. The software provider had been a leader in municipal software, but they purchased other companies, then merged, and were sold (probably not in that order, but they are a shadow of the organization they were when we first began using them 20 plus years ago). Throughout this process, we found the quality of support was slipping, our product line was less and less updated, and the annual contract was becoming increasingly expensive. We evaluated several options, surveyed neighboring towns, and the Town Council approved a contract with BS&A to become our new Town software provider.

The conversion will be completed this summer, beginning in the Clerk-Treasurer's office in May, and will finish up later this summer in Community Development. As a municipality, we expect to see increased efficiencies and improved recordkeeping capabilities.

As a resident, you will see a similar but updated utility bill. Because of the software conversion, meter reading dates will be shifted to April 14, May 11, and June 15. Readings will be on the regular schedule from June forward. You can see your reading between April 14 and May 11 will be a shortened cycle, while the period between May 11 and June 15 will be slightly longer. This will create a shift in your consumption numbers, as the meter read dates will not be on the 15th as they usually are. Additionally, the bill you receive for your usage between May 11 and June 15 that will be mailed July 1 and due on July 20 will include the increased water and refuse rates. Those utility users with a dedicated (separate) sprinkler meter will see the sprinkler minimum charge appear beginning on the bill due July 20. All sprinkler meters are subject to at least the minimum rate even if they are not used.

Finally, the summer sewer discount from the Hammond Sanitary District goes into effect on April 1 and you will see the full impact of that reduction on your bill due June 20th. The discount ends October 1 and you will see the full impact on the bill due November 20. This often leads residents to believe the rate increased, especially this past year when Hammond announced their rate increase, but it is just the end of the summer flow discount. For those of you wondering, the summer discount assumes that the water you consume doesn't automatically return to the sewer but is absorbed by lawns or in pools etc. Hammond offers users a discount because we are not using the sewer system in the same gallon for gallon proportion that we do from October until March.

Please watch for information about enrolling or updating paperless utility bills and your enrollment in automated credit card payments.



Important Notice: Mandatory 10-Digit Dialing Coming to Multiple States/Area Codes Indiana 219, 574

What will be the new dialing procedure?

To complete all locals calls, you will need to dial area code + telephone number. This applies to all calls within your area code that are currently dialed with seven digits.

Who will be affected?

Anyone with a telephone number from your area code will need to make this change from 7-digit local dialing to 10-digit local dialing.

When will the change begin?

Beginning April 24, 2021, you should begin dialing 10 digits (area code + telephone number) for all local calls. If you forget and dial just 7 digits, your call will still be completed.

Starting on October 24, 2021, you must use 10-digit dialing for all local phone calls, if you do not use 10 digits, your call will not be completed and a recording will instruct you to hang up and dial again.

Beginning July 16, 2022, dialing "988" will route your call to National Suicide Prevention and Mental Health Crisis Lifeline.



The Munster Police Department will be Composting is a great way to reduce waste and create offering an Active Shooter Awareness nutrient-rich soil that can be used in place of fertilizer! Presentation on Tuesday, May 18th at 6:00pm at the Centennial Here are some tips to help you get started.

- Vocabulary: greens and browns will be used frequently to distinguish the different types of compostable material. "Greens" are things like fruit and vegetable scraps, lawn trimmings, live plant material, and even coffee grounds! "Browns" are things like dead plant materials (branches, twigs, and leaves), cardboard, paper, newspaper etc.
- Layering is key. Start with greens, add a layer of browns, then add as many layers as necessary. You will always want the final layer to be browns to deter unwanted flies and bugs.
- Strive for a 2:1 ratio of browns to greens, but anything above 1:1 works well.
- Turning/stirring the pile of compost weekly or bi-weekly ensures proper aeration.
- Any container for the compost pile will work. Make sure to keep all openings small enough that little animals cannot get inside.
- Compost piles can take a couple of months to turn into usable fertilizer, so start now to be ready for summer gardening! Additionally, here are some locations where you can drop off food scraps to be composted:

Spring Leaf Collection ended on April 16, 2021!

Branch Collection branches should be no longer than 5' long and 5" in diameter. Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small branches should be bundled and tied; these will be picked up with your garbage. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at (219)836-6971.

Spring rains can cause flooding of yards and streets. Most of the time flooding can be prevented by making sure the drain grates are kept free of debris. It doesn't take much to clog a drain and have it cause significant flooding of streets and/or yards. As material such as leaves, twigs, and litter are washed from the ground surface it collects onto the drain grating and acts like a rubber plug. The flow of water runoff into the drainage system is drastically reduced when material collects near or on the drain grate. Residents can do their part by helping keep drains near your home free of debris.

Public Works offers free wood chips on the first Saturday of the month, 8:00 a.m. - Noon, May through October. Bring your own shovel and something to put the wood chips in.

Household batteries are not being accepted for drop off at Town Hall or the Public Works Facility due to Covid 19. Household batteries are accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Collection (see below for locations) - No CAR batteries.
