This is the time of year the Clerk-Treasurer's office will see an uptick in calls regarding utility bills so I thought this would be a good place to try to bring some clarity to your monthly utility bill.

UTILITY INVOICE 101

Your utility bill is a monthly bill. Your water meter is read around the 15th of each month. The change between meter readings is the consumption amount used to calculate your usage. Your water rate is based on water consumption and meter size.

You will receive your monthly bill, either electronically or through the mail, around the first of each month. Your Town of Munster utility bill is due on the 20th of the month unless the 20th is a holiday or weekend. So, the following may help to clarify. Your next meter reading will be on May 16th. The 15th is a Sunday so it will be read on the next business day. Your usage is calculated on the meter readings between May 16th and June 15th. In the days following June 15th, your bill will be assessed for any applicable late fees, and a current new bill will be generated, reviewed, sent to the printer, reviewed again, and then distributed to the address for each account. The bill you receive around July 1st will be for the meter reading between May 16th and June 15th and will be due on July 20th.

Your water meter reading or usage impacts HSD Residential Flow and the Sales Tax line items on your bill. The HSD Admin Charge, Trash, Sewer Maintenance, and Hydrant line items are all flat fees. All invoices should have both the HSD Admin Charge and HSD Residential Flow charges except the approx. 50 homes in town that have septic systems. Septic users should not see any charges for the HSD Admin Charge or HSD Residential Flow.

SUMMER RATES

The Hammond Sanitary District changes the way the HSD Residential Flow charge is calculated during the summer months. The summer rate is based on your highest winter usage.

This assumes that we, the consumers, are not putting the same amount of water into the sewer system that we do during the winter months, as some of our summer water usage is used to fill pools, water lawns, and wash our cars. Each home is different as far as usage so you may not see much of a change, especially if you are a home that only uses the minimum or the base rate each month.

Approximately 1,000 homes in Munster have a second meter which is primarily used by their inground sprinkler or lawn irrigation systems. All these homes will have a minimum charge, regardless of usage, during the months in which the bill is due in July through November. Residents will often question a November sprinkler bill but remember this would be for usage between September 15th and October 15th and it is common to still be watering our lawns during those months.

The good news is you are not responsible for calculating this! You can trust we are working hard to ensure each resident has the most accurate monthly invoice possible. I do encourage you all to review your bills regularly and if you have any questions, you can contact water billing at (219)836-6948.

MUNSTER POLICE SEEKING 2022 NATIONAL NIGHT OUT EVENT DONATIONS

Preparing for Spring Showers

A gentle warm breeze combined with the fresh scent of blossoming tulips make spring in Munster one of the most majestic times of the year. As you enjoy longer days and

seasonal activities, we encourage you to take a moment to make sure that you are prepared for the springtime rain. Flooding is one of the most common occurring natural disasters in the United States. Spring weather can be unpredictable, but you don't have to get caught off guard. Provided below are several tips to help you prepare for and navigate a flood event.

- Check to make sure stormwater grates around your home and curb are free of debris that may obstruct drainage.
- Check downspouts and sump pump discharge ensuring they are directly away from your home. Use rain barrels to capture water when possible.
- Do not drive or walk-through flowing water. Six inches of water is enough to sweep a person off their feet.
- Be sure to report downed or submerged power lines (911). Electrical current can travel through water.
- Make an emergency plan for you and your family. Practice this plan.



DRAIN GRATES Spring rains can cause flooding of yards and streets. Most of the time flooding can be prevented by making sure the drain grates are kept free of

debris. It doesn't take much to clog a drain and have it cause significant flooding of streets and/or yards. As material such as leaves, twigs, and litter are washed from the ground surface it collects onto the drain grating and acts like a rubber plug. The flow of water runoff into the drainage system is drastically reduced when material collects near or on the drain grate. Residents can do their part by helping keep drains near your home free of debris.



Branch Collection branches should be no longer than 5' long and 5" in diameter. Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small

branches should be bundled and tied; these will be picked up with your garbage. If you have any questions, you can contact the Public Works Department at (219)836-6971.

- Spring Leaf Collection ended April 14, 2022.
- Garbage and Recycling will be delayed one day Monday, May 30, 2022, in observance of Memorial Day.



Unaccounted for water occurs when water is consumed within the town by way of Hammond transmission lines from Lake Michigan but does not get metered through a home or business. There will always be instances of unaccounted water due to preventative maintenance efforts such as hydrant or main flushes and the occasional fire event. Water loss outside of these activities can be structurally damaging to homes, businesses, and infrastructure. It can also be

costly, ultimately resulting in higher service rates. It is imperative that the town address water loss incidents immediately. You too can help our public works department in the effort! Several signs to be on the lookout for that indicate a leak or break in the water main are:

- The sound of running water in a storm drain when you normally would not expect it.
- Unusual humming noises coming from a residential service line or fire hydrant.
- A sudden or unusual drop in water pressure where there are no fires or neighbors watering their lawn.
- Ponding or running water that is not the result of rainfall or a sprinkler use.
