The recent announcement of the \$17 million Rebuilding America Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) grant to improve Ridge Road from the

State Line to Calumet Avenue was a significant accomplishment for the Town of Munster; however, it caught many by surprise.

As with many municipal projects, the start of this process occurred some time ago. In 2019 the Town began planning to improve the Calumet Avenue and Ridge Road corridors. This planning effort spanned more than a year and consisted of traffic studies/modeling, four advisory committee meetings, two meetings with the Munster Public Works Staff, one meeting with the Munster Plan Commission, one meeting with the Munster Town Council, three public workshops, multiple stakeholder Interviews, two online polls and a publicly accessible website.

Throughout this comprehensive and public process, great care and attention were paid to the following planning principles:

- 1. Business Vitality
- 2. Economic Health
- 3. Develop a more welcoming environment for walking and biking
- 4. Reinforce a sense of place in our community.
- 5. Enhance the ability to absorb stormwater and reduce flooding.

With the awarding of the RAISE grant, the planning, engineering and public input does not stop; in fact, it continues. There are many steps that need to take place, even before hiring the engineering firm that will eventually design the plans and put together the construction documentation for the project. This will take some time. We may not see the start of construction until the middle part of 2025.

Please be assured that the traffic on Ridge Road will be of great importance throughout the planning and execution of this project. Additional traffic studies will be taken, industry best practices will be implemented, public input will be solicited and discussion and decisions will be made at public meetings.

Through careful and proactive planning we feel very strongly that this project has great potential to improve Business and Economic Vitality, bring environmental and stormwater benefits to our residents, develop a great environment for walking and biking and reinforce the sense of community that is so strong in Munster.

We retain applications for three years and if your interests have changed or if you are no longer available to serve, please let us know and we will update your application. The Clerk-Treasurer's Office will accept your completed or updated applications.

The MCF is working on celebrating the holidays and will host our second annual tree-lighting community event on Friday, December 2nd from 5:30 pm - 6:30 pm. - You will need to continue to pay your bill for minimum usage. To ensure we are paid accurately and on time, we encourage automatic payment (ACH).
- You will be assessed late fees if an amount goes unpaid.
- You may call us to check on your account balance at www.munster.org/utilitybill. You need your account number to see your balance.
- We can temporarily send your bills to another address and send them to your local address when you get back. Call us to arrange this before you leave and when you have a return date.
- If you want your water turned OFF, you must schedule a time, it must be when someone will be there to confirm it is off (\$28 fee turn on/\$28 fee to turn off).

Be Storm Water Smart



What is an Illicit Discharge?

An illicit discharge is any discharge to the storm sewer system that is not composed entirely of rainwater or groundwater. Illicit discharges include:

automotive fluids; cooking oil and grease; paints, solvents, and chemical cleansers; chlorinated swimming pool water; improperly applied pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizer; landscape waste; soils and sediment; dumpster leachate; sanitary sewer wastewater; and trash.

What is an Illegal Connection?

An illegal connection is the discharge of pollutants or non-stormwater material into a storm sewer system via a pipe or other direct connection. Some sources of illicit connections include sewer laterals connected to the storm sewer rather than the sanitary sewer and floor drains tied into the storm sewer system.

Finding, fixing, and preventing illicit discharges & illegal connections is important to help prevent pollution of our waterways.

Residents can help by reporting illicit discharges or illegal connections to the Public Works Department via email publicworks@munster.org or by calling (219)836-6970.

- Look for makeshift pipes or hoses that lead to a storm drain or body of water.
- Watch for stains, unusual odors and colors, structural damage to streets or gutters, and abnormal vegetative growth in nearby creeks and streams.
- During dry weather, stormwater flows should be nonexistent or minimal. Look for suspicious liquids flowing from pipe outfalls during these times.
- Keep an eye out for anyone dumping anything into the storm sewer system or drainage ditches.
