Town Council members and staff have recently received many questions about the Ridge Road Streetscape plan.

The idea to improve Ridge Road was addressed in the Town's 2010 Comprehensive Plan. The Council members, staff, and residents at that time highlighted opportunities and desires for the corridor. With the South Shore train extension closer to a reality, the Council decided it was a good time to address what had been talked about for years. The Town hired a consultant to develop a plan to improve stormwater runoff, reduce neighborhood street flooding, improve walking and biking connectivity, and make the corridor more attractive and safer overall. It was a yearlong process that included extensive community outreach activity that engaged both staff, businesses along the corridor, school administration, and residents for their input.

That process produced a concept plan. Now it is time to engage a design engineering firm and traffic specialist to conduct more in-depth analyses. The design and engineering phase will include more public discussion and full staff input including our Fire and Police departments. It will analyze current and projected traffic volumes, traffic speed, potential spill over to neighboring streets, emergency vehicle accessibility, and safety improvement strategies. It will also identify solutions for long-term issues like the double stoplight at Harrison, the volume of curb cuts, and the abundance of unsightly utility poles. The goal is to produce an outcome that all residents can be proud of and one that will improve the quality of life along the Ridge Road corridor.

The project will invest \$21 million into the northern part of Munster, with \$4 million coming from the Town due to a large federal grant we received in 2022. The \$4 million will be taken from money on-hand that must be used for capital projects. We are restricted by the grant parameters and state statute how to legally spend the funds.

YOUR WATER RATES AT WORK!

You may have noticed some activity at the water pumping station on Calumet Avenue. Last month, crews began sandblasting the interior of one of the ground storage water tanks behind the station in preparation for full interior reconditioning. After the interior work is completed, a new coat of blue paint will be applied to the exterior of the tank. The second tank will receive a similar treatment. It will take about a month to complete the work on each tank. This work is being staged to keep the pump station operational throughout the improvements. In addition to work on the tanks, flow metering and chlorine dosing pumps will be installed in the pump station.

In August, the elevated tank on Ridge Road will be getting a facelift. Both the interior and exterior of this tank will be sandblasted to remove the old coating systems. The tank will be shrouded to contain the dust from the sandblasting operations. New coatings, including a new logo, will be applied.

The Town's remaining five water storage tanks are scheduled for reconditioning over the next four years. The improvements will protect these important assets in our water system.

DRAIN GRATES

Spring rains can cause flooding of yards and streets. Most of the time flooding can be prevented by making sure the drain grates are kept free of debris. It doesn't take much to clog a drain and have it cause significant flooding of streets and/or yards. As material such as leaves, twigs, and litter are washed from the ground surface it collects onto the drain grating and acts like a rubber plug. The flow of water runoff into the drainage system is drastically reduced when material collects near or on the drain grate. Residents can do their part by helping keep drains near your home free of debris.

BRANCH COLLECTION

Branches should be no longer than 7' long and 5" in diameter. Twigs and yard waste should be put into your garbage cans or bagged. Small branches should be bundled and tied; these will be picked up with your garbage. If you have any questions, you can contact the Munster Public Works Department at (219)836-6971.

FREE WOOD CHIPS

Munster Public Works offers free wood chips on the first Saturday of the month, 8:00 am - Noon, May through October. Bring your own shovel and something to put the wood chips in.



PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL RECREATIONAL BURNING

Burning shall be in a non-combustible container that is sufficiently vented and has enclosed sides and bottom. Only clean wood can be burned (no painted wood, trash etc.). The fire shall be extinguished if it creates a nuisance, fire hazard or pollution problem. No burning shall be conducted during unfavorable meteorological conditions such as high winds, temperature inversions, air stagnation, when there is a pollution alert, ozone action days or during a Red Flag warning. Burning should be at least 10 feet away from any structure.
