Many of you are thinking of football and festivals. In Munster Town Hall, we are excited for the October Budget Season. The Clerk-Treasurer's Office submitted our budget on the Indiana Gateway for Government Units. These numbers tell the State of Indiana what we believe we will need in revenue to cover our projected 2022 expenses. We take many factors into account in determining the revenue number. Ultimately, the State of Indiana informs us how much money we can expect, and what an exciting day that is when we get that notification.

The Indiana Gateway for Government Units can provide you with various financial information for all Indiana municipalities, and I encourage you to visit https://gateway.ifionline.org/ to see for yourself. The October 4th Town Council meeting will have a public hearing for the budget, and as with all public meetings, anyone can attend. A zoom link is provided in the agenda posted on www.munster.org and in the budget submission.

The American Rescue Plan provides an excellent opportunity for our Town. We have already received half of the estimated \$5,074,463.52 we expect to obtain from the plan. The Department of Treasury provided an interim final rule that provides guidelines for governments about how they can spend the money. The first requirement is that we create a plan before we have the authority to spend any of the funds. We have been earnestly working on developing a plan that has a significant effect on our residents. I am pretty excited about the impact this money can have in Munster.

I try to stress in each of these articles that you are welcome to contact me with any questions or concerns you may have, and I appreciate those of you who have reached out. I enjoy talking with the residents, and the feedback from you has been positive and encouraging. If I cannot help you, I share it with the people I believe will answer your question. 2021 FALL LEAF COLLECTION LEAF COLLECTION PICK UP WILL BE ONCE EVERY 2 WEEKS

The Town of Munster 2021 Fall Leaf Collection will begin on, October 4, 2021, and will continue through December weather permitting. Leaves will be picked up between the hours of 7:00 a.m. - 2 p.m., Monday through Friday. The Street Department crews will begin each day where they left off the previous day. **Pick up will be approximately once every two weeks.** State Law prohibits disposal of leaves into landfills. Therefore, leaves in bags will not be picked up by the town or Homewood Disposal Service.

Collection begins each morning promptly at 7:00 a.m. Please have your leaves ready for collection prior to that time. Due to the large area which must be covered each day, we will not be able to back-track into areas which have already been collected. The Town's leaf pickup route will be traveled approximately once every 2 weeks, weather permitting. The following tips will help us continue to provide quality service:

- 1. Place your leaves in a continuous long pile called a "WIND ROW". We will be using a leaf vacuum to collect your leaves.
- If your street has curbs, place your leaves right behind the curb on the parkway grass. Please do not place leaves in the street. If it rains, these leaves could cover the street drains and cause unnecessary flooding.
- 3. If your street does not have curbs, place your leaves on the edge of the street pavement.
- 4. Please refrain from parking on the streets adjacent to piles of leaves between the hours of 7 am to 2 pm.
- 5. Do not place leaves around trees, sign posts, light or telephone poles.
- 6. Do not place sticks, bricks, stones, grass or other materials in piles of leaves. High velocity equipment is used during our removal efforts and these items can do damage to equipment or more importantly, may injure an employee or bystander.

*Leaves will not be picked up in bags. Please rake leaves to parkway. Thank you for your cooperation. If you have any questions, please call the Public Works Department at (219) 836-6971/6970.


