



The conclusion of a year provides a time to review what has been accomplished. Here are just a few of the items that impacted Munster residents from the Clerk-Treasurer's office perspective.

COVID

The Town of Munster began working toward a new normal as the public health emergency, which began in March of 2020, continued. We currently provide a hybrid of in-person meetings and meetings through Zoom. Once the governor ends the health emergency, we are prepared for a different look of public meetings. Ordinance 1830 was passed that allows the Town to host both in-person and virtual meetings, but we will have different requirements about attendance and participation. A schedule of meetings is on the Town website.

AMERICA IN BLOOM

The Town was awarded a grant from America in Bloom. This grant-provided functional landscape along the CN railway that is not only lovely but will provide a sound barrier to the neighboring Centennial Village and Park. One requirement of the grant was to participate in America In Bloom. This project became a collaborative event between departments in Town and community organizations. NEW FIRE CHIEF

Mark Hajduk was hired as the new Fire Chief. Chief Hajduk is working hard to keep Munster residents safe and is partnering with the Rotary Club of Munster to review smoke detectors in homes.

WATER AND TRASH RATES

Although unpleasant but very necessary, water and trash rates increased in 2021. The increase covers the price increase from our suppliers. This prompted a rate study, and we expect rate increases will be a part of our Towns future, not only to cover the annual rate increases from our supplier but also to make necessary improvements to our infrastructure.

FINANCIAL SOFTWARE

We have new financial software in Town. We have been learning the new program and have seen numerous functional improvements both internally and to our residents and organizations. We responded to the requests of many residents for paperless billing and we have delivered. Most residents still get their bills in the mail but more and more are shifting to via email.

WJOB

Councilor Gardiner and I discussed these items and more in further detail on WJOB on December 21st. We planned to discuss our new body cameras in the Police Department, 50/50 sidewalk replacement, the Town's efforts to become more environmentally friendly, and ARPA funds.

SNOW REMOVAL ORDINANCE

With winter nearly here, snow is not far behind. Please keep in mind that according to Town of Munster ordinance, it is unlawful for any person (resident or contractor) to throw, push, or deposit snow, slush, or ice onto any street or sidewalk. Those who violate this ordinance will be subject to a fine.

Also, Town Ordinance 46-3 pertains to the removal of snow and ice from sidewalks. The Ordinance states that the owner and/or the occupant of any dwelling, building or subdivided lot or property shall keep the sidewalks in front of thereof clean at all times of the year. Within 24 hours after any snow fall or formation of ice, such snow or ice shall be removed from the sidewalks.

POSITIVE RESULTS FOUND IN ELEMENTARY DARE PROGRAM STUDY

Following a 3-year, independent evaluation of the effectiveness of the elementary Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Program by UNC Greensboro and Prevention Strategies, they provided a report which is accessible via the link further below. A summary of some of their findings is listed below:

--There were statistically significant reductions in the prevalence of drinking alcohol, getting drunk, smoking cigarettes, and vaping among students who received D.A.R.E. compared to the control cases. The study also concluded that the program was entirely successful in preventing marijuana use.

--D.A.R.E. Officers performed very well in the classroom based on both teacher and student ratings. Teachers and students rated D.A.R.E. Officers extremely high on both program fidelity and engagement actively engaging students during program delivery.

--D.A.R.E. Officer instruction was directly related to positive program outcomes. That is, there were statistically significant correlations between student engagement and student scores at post-test on all variables assessed - increased student engagement was related to positive outcomes on all variables.

--The responsiveness of the D.A.R.E. Officer to the students was also predictive of scores at post-test for variables like decision-making, intentions to avoid drug use, and beliefs about peer norm use.

The Munster D.A.R.E. Program has now been presented in the Munster schools for 33 years and includes lessons for approximately 2,000 total kindergarten, 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 8th grade students each year in Munster. The Munster Police Department appreciates the continued support of their efforts in educating our students about drug prevention, bullying prevention, the importance of making positive choices, and more each school year.
