Hello there! I'd like to provide an update on a few things happening throughout Town. By the end of this construction season, we will have paved over two miles of local streets and alleys and 4,000 feet of sidewalks. Going into the fall, we are

evaluating proposals for water tank maintenance that will begin in the spring as well as teeing-up a request for proposals for help replacing our water meters throughout Town.

While you'll have the opportunity to read more about it elsewhere in this document, I mention the Comprehensive Plan Update here to encourage your participation in the public engagement process. There is an online community survey at https://hla.fyi/ munstercompplan as well as a collaborative map where you can add points of interest and comments.

Your participation and vision for our community is one of the most significant resources that we have. Indeed, when the Town engaged our consultants for the Ridge Road and Calumet Avenue Streetscape Plan, we received over 2,000 pieces of feedback from residents.

Comments and suggestions from residents and businesses in Town showed that there is a widely held perception that sidewalks and street crossings are unsafe; outdoor seating and retail space is desired; that businesses need additional parking; and that trees and plantings within the project corridor are lacking.

The directions that we received resulted in a bold plan to imagine something different for those two corridors, a plan that generated palpable excitement. The preferred option would see portions of some travel lanes on Ridge Road be converted to on-street parking and additional space for plantings and pedestrian safety measures like mid-block crossings and wider sidewalks.

This means that the average distance that a kid has to be in the street to cross Ridge Road is reduced by half from over 90 feet to 45 feet. This means that there will be a 25% reduction in impervious surfaces that shed water straight into our stormwater system and into the river. This means patio and retail space for small businesses. This means shade in the wilting heat. This means a place to go to, rather than a place to get through. Traffic engineers estimated that the proposed changes would result in a one-to-three-minute increase in travel time from the State Line to Calumet Avenue at peak travel times. In life, there are trade-offs to every decision. Survey results showed that all the improvements and amenities that we would gain would be worth an extra three minutes of travel time in our cars.

Staff took this energy and plan and submitted a \$17 million application to the US Department of Transportation for a highly selective Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant for the implementation of the Ridge Road portion of the Streetscape Plan. Munster was one of about 150 communities nationwide that were awarded funding.

This is an exceptional accomplishment for our community.

So what will happen next? We will have to select an engineering partner for the design of the project. That engineer and their team will have to conduct significant due diligence, including updating traffic counts and models. This will take at least a year. After design is complete, the plans will have to be bid and a contractor selected. Construction will take at least two seasons. If all goes well, this project will be complete by the end of 2026.

We are pleased to announce the start of the Munster Comprehensive Plan effort. Over the next year and a half, the Town will be working with Houseal Lavigne Associates, a professional community planning consultancy based in Chicago to build upon past planning efforts, evaluate current data and trends, and incorporate the input and perspectives of Munster residents and businesses into a plan that will serve as a guiding document for the growth and development of the Town for a minimum of 10 years. This will be the first town-wide plan since the 2010 Master Plan. Key outcomes of the plan will be a future land use map, framework plans for transportation, housing, economic development, and community facilities and infrastructure, as well as a detailed implementation plan.

The plan is being guided by a 17-member Advisorv Committee which includes the Town Council and representatives of local businesses, the schools, and other stakeholders. The project kicked off in August and we expect to submit the plan for Town Council adoption in late 2023. We need your input! BRANCH COLLECTION

In an effort to keep the branch collection moving, keep in mind the following:

- Branches should be stacked in one direction and placed in the parkway not in the street.
- Bundle into manageable piles with twine where possible to assist the crew.

BRANCHES WILL BE SKIPPED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:

- Branches or bundled piles of brush should be able to be picked up by one person, generally with a tree diameter no greater than 5" maximum. If diameter is greater the pile will be skipped.
- Any branches from a professional landscaper or tree -trimmer will be not be picked up.
- DO NOT PARK VEHICLES in front of branch piles or the pile will be skipped.
- DO NOT MIX garbage, or debris plant material with branch piles...only tree branches or sticks from pruning are acceptable or the pile will be skipped. (Plant debris should be bagged for Waste Management collection)
- If your branch pile is the size of a vehicle, it is a charge pile with a minimum fee of \$130 to be paid to the Town of Munster prior to collection and a tag will be left at the door.



The lawn watering restrictions put in place in July are no longer in effect. We thank residents for adhering to these guidelines and helping protect our water infrastructure and conserve natural resources.
