#### POLICE DEPARTMENT

I am very pleased to report that on May 9, 2024, the council approved pay raises for our Police Officers; this was part of the commitment the council made to support Public Safety. We also plan to add additional police personnel to ensure that we have more Law Enforcement Officers available to address the needs of our community. We are confident that with these salary adjustments Munster will not only be able to attract the finest officers possible but also retain our experienced officers moving forward.

#### **CALEA**

The Munster Police Department is a proud member of CALEA - The Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies. CALEA was created in 1979 as a credentialing authority through the joint efforts of law enforcement's major executive associations. CALEA has been the Gold Standard in Public Safety, defining professional excellence as the preeminent accrediting body in the field. The CALEA Accreditation Program provides public safety agencies with an opportunity to voluntarily meet an established set of professional standards which require the following:

- Comprehensive and uniform written directives that define authority, performance and responsibilities
- Reports and analyses to make fact-based and informed management decision
- Preparedness to address natural or man-made critical incidents
- Community relationship building and maintenance
- Independent review by subject matter experts
- Continuous pursuit of excellence through annual reviews and other assessment measures

Currently, there are only twenty-one agencies in the State of Indiana that are accredited through CALEA. The twenty-one agencies consist of fourteen municipal law enforcement agencies and four Sherriff's Departments. The remaining accredited agencies belong to University Law Enforcement agencies and the Indianapolis Airport Authority Police Department.


## <u>K-9 UNIT</u>

# From the Clerk-Treasurer, Wendy Mis

As the warmer months approach, many of us find ourselves drawn to the

of us find ourselves drawn to the outdoors. Whether we're tending to our gardens, washing the car, or simply soaking up the sunshine, our water usage tends to increase. With school kids on summer break and college kids home, it's no surprise that utility bills may see a spike due to extra loads of laundry, more frequent baths, or showers, and even the joy of running through the sprinkler. Our furry friends can also contribute to the uptick in water usage; for instance, our dachshund Lenny delights in playing in his own mini splash pad! These seasonal activities can lead to utility bills being higher than usual. However, it's essential to recognize that this increase isn't solely the result of lifestyle changes; part of it is attributed to the way your bill is calculated. Let's delve into summer rates and understand how they may have an impact on your utility bill.

#### SUMMER RATES



You may notice a line item on your bill labeled "HSD Residential Flow" which comes from the Hammond Sanitary District. With activities like filling pools, watering lawns, and washing cars, the volume of water entering the sewer system

fluctuates. During the summer months, this calculation method shifts to reflect these seasonal changes in water usage. While each household's water usage varies, those who typically use only the minimum or base rate each month may not see a significant change.

Approximately 1,000 homes in Munster have a second meter which is primarily used by their inground sprinkler or lawn irrigation systems. Regardless of usage, these homes incur a minimum charge during the billing months from July through November. It's worth noting that receiving a sprinkler bill in November may seem odd, but it accounts for usage between September 15th and October 15th, a period when lawn watering remains common.

#### MINIMUM CHARGE (and included usage)

The minimum charge, determined by the size of your meter, is the basis for your water rate. Usage that exceeds 2,967 gallons for a 5/8" - 3/4" meter or 7,983 gallons for a 1" meter is billed at the appropriate rate. And yes, that minimum gets billed even with zero usage and any usage over what is included with your meter size minimum will be billed based on actual usage. If you have a second water meter for irrigation, you are also subject to the minimum charge, but you are only billed during sprinkler season for the bills due July through November.

The minimum charge covers the cost of delivering water to your home or business. These costs include but are not limited to the base cost of the water, electricity, personnel, the costs of maintenance of the lines and other fixed operating costs. While we strive to keep water delivery costs low, rising expenses affect us all, including the Town, but the minimum charge ensures consistent bills, particularly for those on fixed incomes.
